Letter from our Pastor, Fr Christopher Smith



An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As an undergraduate at Christendom College in Front Royal, Virginia, we were very much formed in, not only the intellectual tradition of the Western mind, but also in the glories of Catholic culture. Many in the college community were Irish-Americans, and proud of their Celtic roots as well as the tenacity with which the Irish held onto their faith amidst centuries of unjust persecution and discrimination. The Feast of Saint Patrick, the Patron Saint of Ireland, was a very important celebration and was a moment for feasting and remembrance as only those that come from the Emerald Isle can pull off. I enjoyed these celebrations, because they were fun, even when singing songs about the sadness of the four green fields being alienated from the fifth field was emotional and heart-wrenching.

I have great memories of these days, but I also confess they were also moments of profound difficultly as well. If you know your history, you are aware that it was the English that caused so much heart ache for the Irish. My Ancestry tests confirmed that my blood is overwhelmingly English, and I have always identified positively with my English heritage. I had to figure out how to reconcile pride in who I was, and the culture that formed me, with the fact that my people are also not uniformly welcome all over the world. It's a complex heritage to be a part of. Saint Patrick's Day always heightened that internal angst. I was very edified by the heroic struggle of English Catholics to keep the faith, and always chagrined at how Irish and English Catholics, who were united in the faith, seemed worlds apart in so many ways, even as they spoke the same language.

On St Patrick's Day, however, everyone is honorary Irish for the day. But a younger me recoiled at feeling like I had to suppress my own heritage to enjoy the memorial of a saint who wasn't Irish either. While others sported their "Kiss me, I'm Irish" T-shirts to jollify the day, I subversively decided to rebel. My college chaplain, who was Lithuanian by birth, liked to poke fun at the Irish for a day leit-motif by giving a rousing sermon on the virtues of Saint Patrick without ever referring to Ireland, instead calling him the Patron Saint of Nigeria. So I started to wear a button with a picture of Saint Patrick on it with the words, "Kiss me, I'm Nigerian" underneath it. Catholicism was brought to Nigeria by Irish missionaries who planted the Gospel in a land which today counts as one of the jewels in the crown of the Catholic Church.

The Catholic Church in Nigeria has produced in its relatively short history, and continues to produce today, such an abundant harvest of vocations that priests and nuns from this West African country are re-evangelizing Ireland and America. The Nigerian Catholic community continues in our own day to produce martyrs who give their blood for the faith just as surely as the Irish who imparted to them the faith. The English colonized both Ireland and Nigeria at various times, and despite its bloody anti-Catholic history for the last five centuries, it is Catholics who go to church in England far more than any of the Protestant denominations that wrested it way from the Barque of Peter so long ago. And who are many of those Catholics? Those of Irish and Nigerian extraction (also a lot of Poles as well) kneel right beside the English Catholics who kept the faith this whole time.

When the people heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, they went forth to meet Him with palm branches. Today we recognize that Christ is truly King, not only of the Jews, but of all nations. His Kingdom is not an earthly Kingdom , but a Kingdom of the Spirit and a Dominion of Love. We place our palms at home behind the Crucifix after Mass today to remember that we share in the Victory of Christ the King when we unite our suffering and passion to His!

#### days of fasting and abstinence

The present laws of the Church regarding fasting and abstinence during the Season of Lent are as follows:

I. Ash Wednesday and **Good Friday** are days of fasting. On days of fasting, one full meal is allowed. Two lesser meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted. Catholics who have completed their 18th year are bound by this law until the beginning of their 60th year.

2. Ash Wednesday and **all Fridays of Lent** are also days of abstinence. On days of abstinence, meat should not be eaten at any meal. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics who have completed their 14th year.

The obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is a serious obligation. The Code of Canon Law states: "On these days (of Penance), the faithful are in a special manner to devote themselves to prayer, to engage in works of piety and charity, to deny themselves, by fulfilling their obligations more faithfully and especially by observing the fast and abstinence..."

# Proclamation of the Golden Jubilee

Did you know fifty years ago, in March 1974, the Parish and Goals Development Committee of St Mary's in downtown Greenville met and decided there needed to be a new parish on the Eastside. That same month the new community was entitled the Greer-Taylors Endeavor. Mass was held in various Protestant churches, such as Grace Methodist Church in Greer, until September 1974 when we the new mission was hosted more stably at Lee Road United Methodist Church. In October 1974 14.5 acres of land was purchased with the generous help of St Mary's parishioners for a new parish. In June 1975 the Greer-Taylors Endeavor came to an end and was split into two new communities. On 12 December 1975



Bishop Unterkoefler erected the Taylors community as Prince of Peace with Christmas as the Patronal Feast.

This means that we are embarking on the fiftieth anniversary of the place we call a spiritual home. On Tuesday, 19 March 2024, we will observe the Opening of the Golden Jubilee of Prince of Peace with an English Mass and Procession for the Solemnity of St Joseph at 7p followed by a Prosecco and Sparking Grape Juice Toast for everyone. We ask that particularly our founders come to that Mass to be recognized. We have a number of exciting events planned all the way until the official Closing of the Golden Jubilee of Prince of Peace on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadelupe on Friday, 12 December 2025. We begin by marking when the mission was first conceived of and Mass first celebrated on the Eastside and conclude when we officially became a parish and were given the title Prince of Peace.

We ask that, if you have unwanted items that have to do with the history of the parish, you consider donating them to the Archives. We hope to do a series of #Throwback Thursday posts on social media to celebrate our history. After Easter, we will have a survey to ask parishioners about their commitment to a capital campaign for the future of Prince of Peace, with special emphasis on music and our award-winning school, that will begin during the Jubilee Year. We also will see during this year the diaconal and priestly ordination and First Mass of our own seminarian, Daniel Perry.

It's a big year for us, and I invite every single family who calls Prince of Peace their spiritual home to consider recruiting one other family to join us! Happy Anniversary and on with the Party!
