Letter from our Pastor, Fr Christopher Smith



An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we continue our 50th anniversary Golden Jubilee, we look backwards to remember the Founders and all the sacrifices they made that ensured the preaching of the Gospel on the Eastside of Greenville. But we also look forward in faith to the many needs we have now and what the Spirit is leading us as a parish family to do now. For several years now I have updated you from time to time on the things that are on the horizon that we need to do. Up until now, those have been more informational rather than action plans. We kept them that way because we were paying off the mortgage from our twenty year old church that we still call new, getting the school on good financial footing after realigning it with its true mission and participating in the Bicentennial Campaign for the Diocese, which allowed us to take up an enormous amount of capital improvement projects to our existing buildings.

You made that happen. Now, we get to look forward to new things, rather than just renewing the old things. We have identified two projects that need to happen in short order. I have asked the Diocese how to go about doing a capital campaign for these two projects, and they have asked us to do an interest survey before giving us the green light to do one of those projects. We plan to do that interest survey on Pentecost, and in the meantime want to present to you the projects for you to have as much information as possible. For the next two weeks in the bulletin, you get to hear about both projects.

Project A: Do you have a computer at home? If you do, you know that they just stop working at a certain point and there's nothing you can do to actually upgrade it because technology has moved on. We call what is in the choir loft an organ, but it is actually a twenty year old computer about to wind down its life expectancy. Prince of Peace is known for liturgy and music, and we do everything at such a high level. It is time to have a world class pipe organ that is a real instrument that can serve worship and the artistic patrimony of the parish and the community. More on that next week.

Project B: The School is the principal apostolate of the parish for the handing on of the Catholic faith. But the work of the school goes on mostly in a building that was not built to be a school. In a competitive marketplace, potential school families want a building which is up to date and secure. Our plan is to connect Walsingham and Lourdes Halls by a building which will allow the Middle School to be in a permanent building instead of a modular building and to give a more logical and safe flow to the school's activity. The modular, Guadalupe Hall, can then be repurposed for the growing needs for space for both the parish and the school.

The Organ Committee and the School have spent months researching plans that would give us what we need but that are actually reachable given the socioeconomic profile of our parish currently. For the next two weeks, the bulletin will give you detailed information on each project as well as contact information to learn more. At Pentecost, we will survey the parish to get a sense of interest, and then decisions have to be made.

Time and time again I have been convicted of the incredible generosity of our parish for needs you all believe in. Numerous times I have had too little faith, and you have always exceeded my expectations. But I have to admit. Fundraising is not my gift. I always feel comfortable informing you of the real financial situation of the parish and what our needs are. But I absolutely hate with a perfect Old Testament hatred asking anyone for money. You have no idea how much I really, really hate it. But it's for God's glory in the case of the organ and for the children, and for all of us, in the case of the school project. And, if you win the lottery, let me know!

Did you know fifty years ago, in March 1974, the Parish and Goals Development Committee of St Mary's in downtown Greenville met and decided there needed to be a new parish on the Eastside. That same month the new community was entitled the Greer-Taylors Endeavor. Mass was held in various Protestant churches, such as Grace Methodist Church in Greer, until September 1974 when we the new mission was hosted more stably at Lee Road United Methodist Church. In October 1974 14.5 acres of land was purchased with the generous help of St Mary's parishioners for a new parish. In June 1975 the Greer-Taylors Endeavor came to an end and was split into two new communities. On 12 December 1975 Bishop Unterkoefler erected the Taylors community as Prince of Peace with Christmas as the Patronal Feast.

This means that we have embarked on the fiftieth anniversary of the place we call a spiritual home. We have a number of exciting events planned all the way until the official Closing of the Golden Jubilee of Prince of Peace on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadelupe on Friday, 12 December 2025.

We ask that, if you have unwanted items that have to do with the history of the parish, you consider donating them to the Archives. After Easter, we will have a survey to ask parishioners about their commitment to a capital campaign for the future of Prince of Peace, with special emphasis on music and our award-winning school, that will begin during the Jubilee Year. It's a big year for us, and I invite every single family who calls Prince of Peace their spiritual home to consider recruiting one other family to join us! Happy Anniversary and on with the Party!
