

processions for minor rogations

Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, 6-8 May, are Minor Rogation Days, traditional days of prayer, and formerly fasting preceding the feast of the Ascension. The word "rogation", means to supplicate or ask, and the purpose of the days are to beg God for His mercy, to turn away His anger, and to ask Him to bless the fruits of the earth while protecting us from natural disasters.

And I say to you: Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and you shall find; knock and it shall be opened unto you. For every one that asketh; and he that seeketh findeth; and to Him that knocketh it shall be opened. Luke II:9-I0, from the Gospel for the Rogation Mass

At the Minor Rogations (MTW before Ascension) the procession starts at 11.45a so that the school can join.
