Kate's story begins in Paris, Kentucky, where she received a Catholic education before transitioning to public school. She pursued her undergraduate degree in psychology at the University of Kentucky. Greg, her future husband, grew up in Horse Cave, Kentucky, raised in the Baptist Church. He attended Eastern Kentucky University, earning a Bachelor's degree in Fire and Safety. Their paths crossed in graduate school, where Kate was studying mental health counseling, and Greg was pursuing a master's in occupational safety and Ergonomics.

In 2013 they married and spent a year in Tupelo, Mississippi, for Greg's job, before returning to Central Kentucky. Greg dedicated ten years to Toyota as an Occupational Safety Specialist, while Kate served as a Behavior Specialist, supporting children and adults with intellectual disabilities and their families. Their family grew with the birth of their daughter, Sydney, in 2015.

In 2017, Greg was offered a position at BMW in Greenville, South Carolina. Although they initially declined, preferring to stay near family, they reconsidered when Connor was born in 2018. BMW called again, and this time, they felt a clear sense of discernment. After attending a Saturday



evening Mass at Prince of Peace with Fr Richard Tomlinson and experiencing a profound sense of homecoming, they knew the move was meant to be. By the start of 2020, the Witherspoons had settled in Greenville. Shortly after their arrival, COVID transformed everyone's lives and the Witherspoons had a wonderful experience of observing the virtual classroom of their daughter. It affirmed their decisions.

In 2021, Kate began the Basic Course with the Marian Catechists, followed by the Advanced class. These courses not only deepened her faith, but also equipped her to answer Greg's growing questions about Catholicism. Surrounded by faith-filled dads at the parish school and inspired by their daughter Sydney's growing spiritual journey and vocabulary, Greg felt the Holy Spirit prompting him towards unity in faith. In October 2021, the Witherspoons hosted the Catholic Identity Committee's traveling Holy Family Statue, using the included prayer cards to consecrate their family. Six weeks later, Greg announced his plan to join the RCIA the following September. It felt miraculous.

Greg's confirmation was a testament to the power of knowledge, prayer, and community support. He now attends the Masters of the Spiritual Life course and participates in various activities with the POPCS Dad Squad.

"I thank God every day we are here" said Kate, who has become involved in the parish school, serving on its Catholic Identity Committee for 2 years and chairing the PTO. Sydney, who just completed 3rd grade, has a special devotion to Our Lady of Guadalupe, sharing her feast day with her baptismal anniversary. Connor, entering K5 at POPCS, aspires to be both Pope John Paul III and Batman. Their joyful and faith-filled upbringing is a testament to the nurturing environment of their school and parish.



A deacon is an ordained minister of the Catholic Church. There are three groups, or orders, of ordained ministers in the Church: bishops, priests, and deacons.

Deacons are ordained for a ministry of service, which they carry out under the authority of the Bishop. All ordained ministers in the Church are called to functions of Word, Altar, and Charity.


