Meet the Upart Family

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Chicagoans for more than two decades, the Upart family made South Carolina their home in 2016, when April Dauscha-Upart received a fortuitous offer to start a fiber arts program at the Fine Arts Center, a performing and visual arts high school in Greenville.

Anatole and April are both converts to Catholicism at the young adult age, although on their respective maternal sides they come from families that were originally Catholic. Traditional sacred art and the study of its history played a crucial role in their conversions. They took to heart the famous words of HH Pope Benedict XVI as an affirmation of their own conversion path: "What earlier generations held as sacred, remains sacred and great for us too..." These words were also a roadmap for what Anatole and April set out to do for the preservation and growth of the Catholic identity and Catholic culture at home and at large. They are parents to now five children: the oldest one is an organist and choir singer, Br Ephrem OP (a Dominican for four years, he just



finished his second year of seminary in St. Louis); Veronika (a pre-med college freshman); Perpetua & Ursula (avid readers and newly 6th and 4th graders), and Euphemia (a 6-month-old inveterate traveler).

Born and raised in Louisville, KY, April went to college in Chicago (where she met Anatole) and to grad school in Richmond, VA. She has exhibited her work nationally, at the Fuller Craft Museum, MANA Contemporary, and Tracey Morgan Gallery, and internationally in Germany, South Africa, Israel, Portugal, and Serbia. She sat on the boards of various arts organization, such as Surface Design Association (SDA); did artist residencies in places such as McColl Center and Vermont Studio Center; and taught at Penland School of Craft.

Born in Belarus (then part of USSR), Anatole Upart had come to the United States as a refugee with his parents in early 1990s. Dr Upart has taught at numerous universities and is currently a Lecturer in Architectural History at the State University of New York in Binghamton. Anatole was elected a Fellow of the Royal Society of Arts (London, UK, 2022). That same year, Don Pedro of Bourbon-Two Sicilies, the Duke of Calabria and the Heir to the Neapolitan throne, invested Dr Upart as a Knight of Merit of the Sacred Military Constantinian Order of St. George. In 2024, he was elected an Associate Fellow of the Royal Historical Society in UK and also became the Chair of the Americas Branch of the Society for Court Studies. For three years (2021-2024), he has been the chair of the Historic Review Board (known as Design Review Board – Neighborhoods before 2023) for the City of Greenville.

Despite (or maybe because of) their busy schedules, the life of the Upart family, spread so thinly across both sides of the Atlantic with different exhibitions, conferences, semesters, is centered around the Holy Mass – it appears to be the best (and strongest) anchor one can hope for and one could be thankful to God for in this life.

Please do not come to the parish office expecting your child to receive a sacrament immediately without proper records and attendance at mandatory sacramental events/ meetings. The Homeschool RE Registration Form outlines the requirements for each sacrament for our homeschooling families. ALL First Holy Communion YEAR 2 and Confirmation YEAR 2 registration forms must be turned in prior to the yearly December deadline for a child to participate in a spring sacrament.




