17 years of marriage all began with a surprise introduction by a mutual friend of both Kevin and Erin. The story goes that Kevin, a Sherriff's Deputy at the time, did what any self-respecting officer would do—he ran a background search on Erin to make sure she was on the up and up. When everything came up clear and they were on their first date at Smoke on the Water, he couldn't help but double-verify his findings over conversation. When Erin found that endearing, their fate was sealed! Erin recalls never laughing as hard or having as much fun on a date until meeting Kevin!

Kevin is a long time Greenville resident—nearly official Greenvillian status —who arrived here at age 3, graduated from Mitchell Road Christian Academy, then Southside Christian, then The Citadel. While working in law enforcement, he was injured in the line of duty and avoided life-changing spine surgery through the care of a trusted chiropractor. That transformational experience sparked a desire to return to school to earn his Doctor of Chiropractic. Together, Erin and Kevin own Greenville Spine Institute: Expert Chiropractic Care. The "expert" in the business name reflects his authority as a local expert witness at trial in injury cases especially utilizing his advanced certifications in whiplash biomechanics and brain injury traumatology.

Erin, originally from Iowa, found her way to Greenville via a job transfer with Milliken from their Manhattan-based office to Spartanburg. She retired in 2017 as a Major and Director of Logistics for Air for the state of North Carolina after 20 years of service in the National Guard. Among her most memorable opportunities for service, she was deployed to Ground Zero to provide security detail and escort families of victims to a viewing platform near the disaster "so they could better understand why so many bodies were never recovered." People came and left letters, flowers, and keepsakes for their loved ones. In one particularly emotional tribute, Erin recalls a very young girl left her favorite teddy bear for her father who was still missing in hopes that he would be found alive. Tragically, he was not.

Kevin and Erin's life revolves around faith, family, service and career. They have 6 children—5 boys and 1 girl—ranging from the oldest who is 16 to the youngest, age 4. Erin is a homeschooling Mom who, while teaching her children, simultaneously grew her own understanding of faith by earning a Masters of Theology with a concentration in Dogmatic Theology from Holy Apostles College and Seminary. She graduated cum laude. When life is a bit chaotic, you can find them dancing their cares away around the kitchen island or sipping wine by the fire. After multiple moves, they've obtained what is likely their lasting home together raising donkeys and chickens, four wheeling, and running a small family farm. They have a dog named Maggie, too!

To see the Lewis family from the outside, it likely seems like a fairytale. But, Kevin and Erin have faced and overcome many trials in



marriage, business and health that yield the family you see actively involved at the Latin Mass, participating in Fraternus, frequenting the Adoration Chapel, and giving of their time, talent and treasure to the parish and school community. Four of their sons are altar servers. And, Kevin and Erin received a Papal Knighthood in 2022 as they were accepted into the Equestrian Order of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem.
