Letter from our Pastor

Dear Friends.

At Prince of Peace, we always talk about the biblical tithe: 10% goes to God, and we recommend that to be broken down as follows: 5% to the parish, 4% to the charity of one's choice (and we encourage that to go to our own St Vincent de Paul, the Annual Fund for the school, and, soon, our school fundraising project) and 1% to the Bishop.

You may not know that 10% of the offertory is assessed by the Bishop as what is called the *cathedraticum*, a tax for the administrative apparatus of the Diocese. Over and above that, we have what was until recently called the Bishop's Annual Appeal, which has been renamed the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina. The Bicentennial Campaign was conducted at the same time as the CASC, but this year closes that out, and we now have just the CASC as the diocesan campaign. While the Bicentennial Campaign was going on, many people adjusted their giving to that and stopped giving to the Bishop's campaign. In fact, Prince of Peace has the dubious distinction of being one of the lowest performing parishes in terms of participation percentage in the deanery for that campaign. Now that the Bicentennial Campaign is drawing to a close, the Diocese is very eager that we make a good faith effort to educate our faithful on the CASC and encourage them to participate. If we all do our 1%, I think we can make progress towards the goal that the Diocese sets for us.

As of writing this letter, we have achieved 27.24% of our \$112,901 goal which was set for us by the Diocese for the CASC. 10.37% of our households are participating.

There have been a lot of asks recently. There is the usual week in and week out operating offertory ask, as well as the monthly SVDP ask, and asks for smaller items like the pew missals, parish picnic and decorations for Christmas and Easter. Giving Tuesday is coming up in December, which we are now using to fund the Annual Fund for the school. Next year we are going into full capital campaign mode for the school. The Diocese has also initiated asks for seminarians, since so many were accepted this year, and for the St Rita Fund, to defray the 900K cost the Catholic schools have to eat after the Supreme Court of the State of South Carolina ruled the ESTF funds for schools, a kind of tuition voucher system, was unconstitutional.

I am always of the mindset that you have to pray over your giving, and give accordingly. The Bishop and diocesan officials have asked me to present this to you and give you an opportunity to make an in-pew pledge. There are many needs, which all indicate the pains of a growing Church. I ask that you learn as much as you can about the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina, and be as open as you can to participating in it.



My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

In October, the Church celebrates the Month of the Holy Rosary. We remember in a special way the Battle of Lepanto when, losing all hope of victory, Pope St. Pius V urged the faithful to pray the rosary. A miraculous victory was won Oct. 7, 1571, thanks to the power of this prayer and the intercession of Mary.

In his encyclical on the rosary, *Ingruentium Malorum*, marking 400 years after the Battle of Lepanto, St. Pius XII expressed the challenges of his own time. I echo his words, which we find as relevant today as they were in 1951:

"You know well, Venerable Brethren, the calamitous conditions of our times. Fraternal harmony among nations, shattered for so long a time ... we see souls upset by hatred and rivalry ... threats of new bloody conflicts ... the violent storm of persecution, which in many parts of the world, has been unleashed against the Church, depriving it of its liberty ... and making the blood of martyrs flow again and again" (IM).

He makes clear the turbulence of the era characterized by polarization, hatred, fear and persecution. Throughout the encyclical, Pius XII reminds us of the power of the rosary and specifically the power of a family praying the rosary together.

Now, we stand in a unique position in history with an opportunity and responsibility to intercede on behalf of our future political leaders, the coming election, this great country and our world. By taking up the beads of the rosary daily, we call out to our heavenly mother, pleading for her loving intercession. Mary desires to aid us and asks her son for the graces we need. All we must do is faithfully meditate on the life of Jesus through her eyes. This devotion gives a glimpse into the very nature of the Blessed Virgin, who "kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart" (Lk 2:19).

As your bishop, I ask that each family make an effort to pray the rosary at least once a week throughout the month of October and in the days leading up to the general election and beyond. Parents, if possible, pray at least a decade of this beautiful prayer each day with your children. Be assured that the sacrifice of your time for this devotion will be multiplied. You will not regret leading your family in prayer.

Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us! Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception, patroness of the United States, pray for us!
