Dear Friends,

As I write, our community continues to grapple with the impact of Hurricane Helene. I have seen the devastation it has caused firsthand—damaged homes, families displaced, businesses suffering, and countless lives disrupted. For some, the storm has brought financial instability, emotional turmoil, and even physical burdens. There are also many beyond our area who have lost their lives, and more remain missing or unaccounted for. In the midst of this, we gather as a parish family, united in our shared grief and our unwavering faith in the Lord.

We are not immune to the struggles and pain that such destruction brings. The anxiety and fear that accompanies the loss of safety and stability can be overwhelming. But it is precisely in times like these that we are called to remember that God is with us, even in the storm. Jesus, who calmed the sea and walked on water, is with us now—He has not abandoned us. Our sufferings are not unnoticed, and our cries have not gone unheard. Scripture reminds us, "The Lord is near to the brokenhearted and saves the crushed in spirit" (Psalm 34:18). In the days following the storm, I have witnessed countless examples of holy helpers—men and women who have risen to the challenge, offering their time, energy, and prayers. We have held Mass and administered the sacraments in a church without power for days, and yet the light of Christ shines brighter than ever in our parish. You, my brothers and sisters, are a beacon of hope to one another. Whether it be offering a warm meal, opening your home to those displaced, or simply lending an ear to listen, you have embodied the love of Christ to those in need. For that, I am deeply grateful and inspired.

Our parish has emailed a "matching program" to connect those in need who have no options with those who are able to help. If your home has been damaged and you have not found assistance with repairs, or if you have the strength and skills to offer physical help, please reach out. We will endeavor to match your request with volunteers from our parish community who can assist you. Let us bear one another's burdens as Christ calls us to do. Email <u>communications@princeofpeacetaylors.org</u> for links to join the program.

In addition, I offer the following ways you can help as we move forward in faith together:

1. Pray – Never underestimate the power of prayer. Pray for those who have lost loved ones, those still searching for the missing, and all those working to rebuild their lives.

2. Volunteer – If you have the ability, consider offering your time and skills through our parish's matching program. Whether it is helping clear debris, repair homes, or offering emotional support, your help is needed.

3. Give – If you are financially able, consider contributing to our parish with "Hurricane Helene" marked in the memo to support families and small businesses affected by the hurricane. Your generosity will help rebuild our community.

Though the road to recovery may be long, we walk it together, trusting in God's providence. As St. Paul reminds us, "We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed" (2 Corinthians 4:8-9). Let us hold fast to the hope we have in Christ, knowing that He is our refuge and our strength.


