An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

When my wife and I moved to Greenville and joined Prince of Peace seven years ago, I can remember seeing gatherings for young adults advertised in the bulletin. Now, the staff here at POP are as careful as possible to include the "Who, What, When, and Where" people need to decided if an event is for them, but given our backgrounds being involved in the Evangelical Protestant world, we had preconceived categories for just who a "young adult ministry" was meant to serve. We had two children at the time with a third on the way, and we were always perplexed by exactly who the parish was inviting.

According to the USCCB, "young adults are those young people from all cultural communities and abilities between ages 18 and 39 who are single or married, with or without children, divorced or widowed, and in college, working, unemployed, incarcerated, or in the military." This is an incredibly broad and diverse group of adults! The experiences and needs of a single 18 year old are clearly very different from those of a married 39 year old parent of 5.

While this is certainly true (as a 37 year old married father of 5, ask me how I know!) I don't believe for a moment that the core needs of any age group are fundamentally different. Within the Church's treasury of wisdom, we read that "The vocation of humanity is to show forth the image of God and to be transformed into the image of the Father's only Son. This vocation takes a personal form since each of us is called to enter into the divine beatitude; it also concerns the human community as a whole (CCC, 1877)."

This vocation is the perennial both/and of Catholicism. Yes, certainly there is an inner personal call to conversion - that process which we remember beautifully as the "universal call to holiness," - but it is not an isolated change in the individual which the Church is called to cultivate. We are drawn together by Christ's will into an institution. We're incorporated into a society formed by Christ himself and preserved by his Grace. We are knit together in a Mystery of mutual support and encouragement, urging one another like Saint Paul exhorts us to outdo one another in love (Rom 12:9-21).

Prince of Peace is a parish of marked diversity. I love that we have single men & women, young families, grandparents & great-grandparents, veteran married couples as well as newlyweds all kneeling side by side before the Altar of Christ and united in our worship of Him.

This bounty also suggests the problem of having groups who our existing ministries aren't fully engaging. The Upstate is growing tremendously, and as a parish we want to deepen our outreach and service to those who are calling the Upstate - and in particular Prince of Peace - their home; we want to explore new ways to form bridges between the beautiful diversity in this parish, and to do that we need you.

The Diocese has made serving our young adults a focused priority. This means holding retreats, hosting public diocesan events like Theology on Tap, and seeking to equip parishes to serve the young adults in the pews. You can find all these on our social media and in our bulletin. While we don't currently have a formal "young adult ministry" in this parish, we would like to begin connecting those of you who are passionate about building an edifying community of men and women for the purpose of not merely staying in segregated age-brackets, but of equipping you to know, love, live & share your Catholic Faith with the world around us.

The transforming community of Grace is the Church herself - and like all parishes the world over, we need everyone, particularly our young adults, to join the work of building up the Kingdom here in Taylors. We are seeking to accompany and challenge young men and women in their vocations and help them become leaders in the parish and the Church beyond. We have parish events and ministries which need your help and would love your participation! If you're interested in joining a team to engage young adults in our parish with events and opportunities to deepen sense of Catholic Community while building a Catholic Culture here in the upstate, please contact me at 864.331.3902 or by email at michael.sandifer@princeofpeacetaylors.org. 

Their hair and nails may be fully grown, and the vernix caseosa, a creamy white substance that protects their skin, is thinning. year c begins now

Did you know the Lectionary follows two cycles: one for Sundays and one for weekdays? The Sunday cycle has three years—A, B, and C. Year A focuses on the Gospel of Matthew, Year B on Mark and chapter 6 of John, and Year C on Luke. The Gospel of John is also read every year during the Easter season. The liturgical year begins not on I January but on the First Sunday of Advent, when we switch to a new cycle year.

The first reading, usually from the Old Testament, complements the Gospel theme, while the second reading, often from an epistle, is read nearly continuously, picking up from the previous week. Year C readings in the St. Isaac Jogues Missals start on December 1.

immaculate conception

The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrates the conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary in the womb of her mother, St Anne, free from original sin by virtue of the merits of her son Jesus. The feast day is 8 December, which lands on Sunday this year, therefore, is moved to Monday, 9 December. It is a Holy day of obligation.

Jean-Jacques Olier was a 17th century priest who had the most fashionable parish in Paris, but noticed that his college students at the Sorbonne were basically pagans, and that many of his people did not really understand the spiritual meaning of what they saw and did at Mass. So he set about making the Church of Saint Sulpice a model of Christian faith and practice, and formed generations of priests in sanctity and communal life. His book, The Mystical Meaning of the Ceremonies of the Mass, remains even today as a classic of the spiritual life. His poetic approach to theology sees in every rite and ceremony of the Mass a parallel to the life of Christ, and in which we access that life. This is not just a history of the Mass, but a spiritual meditation on the sacred liturgy.
