# Letter from our Pastor

## An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends,

As you may be aware, on the Solemnity of Christ the King this year I was installed as an honorary canon of the Cathedral of the Holy Spirit in Istanbul, Turkey. I spent a lot of quality time with the Bishop, and I wanted to give you some updates about the situation there. The best news to report is that there are now seven seminarians studying for the diocesan priesthood for the Apostolic Vicariate including two Turks and three Iranians. I am also happy to report that Artem, a Polish-Russian Latin Catholic, who hails from our sister parish in Bursa, has also started the formation process. The Bishop has been finding scholarships for these men to pursue their studies, and so they are in seminaries all over the world at this point! There has not been the ordination of a diocesan priest in Istanbul in over 70 years and now God is raising up men from their own to shepherd the people of God.

Often people have a very strange idea that the Vatican must fund foreign missions. They also think that the Diocese helps parishes out when in actuality it is the other way around; the parishes pay an annual tax to the Bishop to fund the central administration of the Diocese. The annual budget of the entire Vicariate Apostolic of Istanbul, to fund the work of over 35 priests and 12 parishes, given by the Holy See, is actually less than our average weekly offertory. Imagine that!

Right now, the cathedral where I was installed as canon is under restoration. The altars and the chandeliers were covered, and there was dust everywhere. I was happy to see that some generous souls had come forward to restore the cathedral to its original splendor, and I cannot wait to see it in its finished state.

There are also nearly 300 adult catechumens preparing for baptism in Turkey, most of them in Istanbul itself. The priests are very hard at work accompanying these brave souls who often lose their families and friends to embrace the Gospel of Jesus Christ. There are 12 sisters now working in the apostolates from the Servants of the Lord of the Virgin of Matarà. There is great growth in the community at Bursa, which now has Sunday Mass and a place for the community to gather, thanks in grand part to the generosity of Prince of Peace parishioners. The first Turkish convert to be ordained a bishop, was just made the Apostolic Administrator of the Apostolic Vicariate of Anatolia, the eastern part of the country, on the first anniversary of his ordination.

What a joy to see the Spirit moving in the Holy Land of the Church, especially after our parish pilgrimage to Greece, where we were able to pray in the places where St Paul, St John and the Blessed Mother advanced the cause of the Good News in the first generation of the Church. Next year, the entire Church celebrates the Jubilee Year as well as the 1700<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Council of Nicea, near our sister parish in Bursa, which is preparing for the anniversary celebrations! It is a privileged time to be alive and see the work of the Church bearing fruit that will last, both at home and abroad!
