Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends.

On St Nicholas' Day, the children of POPCS led us in a beautiful Service of Lessons and Carols to get into the right spirit for Advent and Christmas. I am grateful to Ms Jeanie Reed and to all of the school faculty and staff and families that made such an evening possible. I wanted to use this as an opportunity to talk to you about the role of the arts in our parish and school community.

A pragmatist, technocratic tendency in our modern world increasingly sees the arts as tangential to education and secondary. I wince every time I hear the term *related arts*. Nothing could be further from the way the Catholic Church, which has always been a patron of the arts, sees the role of arts in the formation of young people. We are so blessed to have Ms Marilyn Alber and Ms Jeannie Reed as the leads in our school community. They are consummate professionals with incredible experience, and our school is made so much better by their work, which has nurtured generations of young people to become alive to beauty.

Music is not an add-on, or an extra, but an integral part of Catholic worship. And the way we worship influences culture. For that reason, it is also an integral part of the curriculum of a Catholic school. In an age where schools are cutting funding for the arts for all the wrong reasons, Catholic schools see the powerful human dimension that involving children in the beautiful brings, and so we are investing more, not less in that human and divine project.

The human voice is the most perfect instrument because it is the only one created by God. Prince of Peace gives pride of place to music in every area of our life from Mass to class, because of that fact. The fundamentals of music theory, Gregorian chant as the music of the Church, vernacular hymnody and a broad education in musical performance and appreciation are a hallmark of the Catholic culture of our parish that is chiefly transmitted by the school.

Participation in choirs and serving at Mass as altar servers or lectors are not extracurricular activities among many. They are an outgrowth and overflowing of a Christian vision of the human person, destined for glory by means of active participation in worship. As such, every single member of the Prince of Peace Catholic Church and School family should endeavor to use the gift of their voice to the fullness of his or her ability. We are delighted to be able to offer what are extracurricular activities of many kinds, and we want to offer more, and we want our kids to be well rounded. But music has pride of place, because of its intrinsic connection with the worship of Almighty God. Nothing should conflict with the worship of God and those things that are connected with it.

One of the most challenging aspects of our secular and often ugly culture is that music has been reduced to a hobby for some talented people, and in the days of AutoTune and AI, the authentic gifts of every single child to create art and make music are being drowned out by an ideology that is not of God, and not fully human either. I invite our community to be more intentionally countercultural by committing time, talent and treasure to the pride of place that Christ gives music in His Church, and in Catholic formation.

Pope Benedict XVI wrote, I am convinced that music really is the universal language of beauty which can bring together all people of good will on earth. The evangelizing power of beauty is something our world desperately needs, and it begins with every baptized Christian singing and fully participating at Mass and forming children in their Catholic artistic and musical heritage. But we must work together to protect that right and ensure its vitality is unleashed. In the document Musicam Sacram the Church teachers: One cannot find anything more religious and more joyful in sacred celebrations than a whole congregation expressing its faith and devotion in song. Prince of Peace's reason to exist is this: to praise the Lord! So let us be faithful to that mission.
