Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends,

One of the many burdens on my heart for a while now is trying to find good resources from a Catholic perspective that impart a sound theological formation in Christian virtue as well as sound emotional intelligence formation for young people. Our young people often struggle and have so many challenges and so much baggage that people in my generation can't imagine, and often parents are lost as to what to do. I began a conversation months ago with our parishioner Kate Witherspoon using her professional background to explore resources for this need. Kate has spent an incredible amount of time researching this, and dealing with my impatient enthusiasm to find something to consider. She has come to me with a proposal. I have submitted that proposal to several members of the staff to discern how and when to implement in various aspects of parish life. But I want to offer it for our parents and grandparents who might be looking for a similar resource as well for their own private use.

I am very excited about the possibilities this particular mode of virtue education and formation in emotional intelligence can offer. My profound gratitude goes to Kate for her work on this:

Emotional Intelligence is a term that gained prominence in the 1990's referring to one's ability to perceive, control, and evaluate one's emotions. Since this time, we have observed a growing AWARENESS of mental health, without addressing the CRISIS of mental health. We continue to observe increased rates of teenage suicides, dependence upon antidepressants, and constant instances of burnout/overwhelm in daily life. Much of the information shared by the media, and even therapists in clinical practice, view mental health through the lens of moral relativism. This leads to challenges within Catholic circles as we seek to grow in grace and sacramental living, while addressing our "concept of self" with pieces of poppsychology, and "living your own truth". It is of utmost importance to teach our children how to manage their very real emotions; how to resolve conflict with others; how to be resilient in the face of failure and adversity, but we MUST teach them to do so without compromising their faith.

Open Light Media places Social Emotional Learning within the framework of our Christian anthropology, and Baptismal graces to teach Catholics of all ages how to become emotionally intelligent individuals, acknowledging the sanctifying graces we received at Baptism, strengthened in Confirmation and nourished by the Holy Eucharist. 

The Archdiocese of Atlanta is hosting The Way, a healing retreat for female survivors of abuse. The retreat will be held 14-16 February 2025.


