# Letter from our Pastor

# An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends.

The Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate reported in 2015 that, in the United States, weekly Mass attendance was only five percent among millennials who attended non-Catholic schools. As Emily Raines wrote for the Cardinal Newman Society magazine in 2021, "Unless we take seriously, right now, the need to give every Catholic child a Catholic education, our churches will be nearly empty of young people before the decade is over. And our nation will suffer as well. Eight years ago, only about one in 10 Catholic children attended Catholic schools. Today Hispanic families account for the majority of Catholic children, yet more than 95 percent of them enroll in public schools."

What are reasons not to enrol your child in Catholic schools?

- 1) It is a cheap alternative to private education.
- 2) It is a school just like public schools just with Mass and some prayers, and that's kind of nice because we're Catholic.
- 3) So my children won't have to go to school with (fill in the blank with a racist or classist category of people you don't like but are too polite to admit publicly).

What are reasons to enrol your child in Catholic schools?

- I) Because I made a promise at the baptism of my children to raise my children in the Catholic Faith and the Magisterium of the Catholic Church has consistently taught that Catholic schools are the best way to do that.
- 2) Because Catholic schools have a vision of the human person and objective truth rooted in divine revelation and reason that affects every aspect of the life of the school.
- 3) Because we educate children not because they're Catholic, but because we're Catholic. It is part of the Great Commission to make disciples of all people, and Catholic schools inculcate respect for the human person as the image and likeness of God.

What are reasons not to prefer other schools over Catholic schools?

- 1) My child's friend groups or my family social status
- 2) I am not willing to sacrifice comfort and disposable income for Catholic education
- 3) Extracurricular activities are more important than the academic curriculum

What are reasons to enrol my child in a non-Catholic school and not a Catholic school

- I) My child has specific educational needs, that my Catholic school cannot do justice to because of their limited resources, and parish, school and parents are in agreement that it is not the best fit right now for my child. God has blessed my child in an unusual and prodigious manner and after a conversation with our Catholic school we realise that those gifts can be cultivated in another school situation.
- 2) After a dialogue with my Catholic school, and going through the process for determination of real financial aid, the limited resources of my family and the school are not a match that we can really do at this time.
- 3) My family has very real practical considerations around work, caregiving, family dynamics and finances that, after careful dialogue with the school, do not permit us right now to be a part of our Catholic school.





# Prepare for Lent

# fr smith's lenten reading recommendation



This year marks the 1700th anniversary of the first of the 21 ecumenical councils of the Catholic Church, the First Council of Nicea. The Emperor Constantine called all of the bishops of the world to a meeting to develop a consensus on what the deposit of faith had to reveal about the divinity of Jesus Christ. Christians were divided amongst themselves because of the novel teaching of Arius that Jesus was not fully God, which provoked the censure of Saint Athanasius of Alexandria. The result of that meeting was a profession of faith called the Nicene Creed, which we pray every Sunday (albeit with a few additions from another ecumenical council, Constantinople I, from 381).

But where is Nicea today? Our parish has a long standing relationship with the Church in Turkey, specifically with the parish in Bursa, which is the closest Christian community near the site of ancient Nicea, known in Turkish as Iznik. Today, tourists go to Iznik to see the tremendously beautiful tile work produced by expert craftsmen. Christians will go and, when they find out that they are standing in the city of the first ecumenical council, will ask themselves where that historic event took place.

Mark Fairchild, a theology professor at Huntington University, was part of an archeological expedition underwater which found a basilica that matches all of the known data about the place the council was held. His book: The Underwater Basilica of Nicaea: Archaeology in the Birthplace of Christian Theology was released in November 2024. In this book, the Indiana Jones of the Primitive Church discusses the world where this council took place, how Christianity came to it and why the Emperor chose it, out of so many possible places, for a meeting that would change the course of Christian history. The discovery of an underwater church and royal meeting hall in 2014 and the daring research done about it has been one of the most groundbreaking events in archeological and theological history. How did it end up at the bottom of a lake, and what secrets does it yield about our Christian history that are relevant for today?

When we recite the Nicene Creed every Lord's Day, it's hard to envision where it came from, and sometimes, even why it has been such an important part of Christian belief and practice enduring over 1700 years! After reading this book as our parish Lenten reading, my hope is that, by learning more about our ancient Christian history near the place where we cooperate in mission, the Creed will come alive as a vital part of our worship!
