Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends,

As the parish continues to grow and expand, the demands on our facilities become greater. There are numerous ministries and activities which we have unfortunately had to say No to, for the mere fact of lack of space. Currently, Guadalupe Hall, the modular building, houses our middle school program during the day, some Bible studies during the week, and some RE classes on Sundays. Lourdes Hall and Walsingham Hall serve the elementary school, library, art and computer room during the school day, as well as RE on Sundays and a number of meetings throughout the week. Croghan Hall, the old church space, and the PAC are in constant use for parish, school and RE activities.

Very soon, we are going to embark on a \$1.5 million capital campaign to physically expand and connect Guadalupe Hall, Lourdes Hall and Walsingham Hall. I think most people appreciate the benefit to the school, as we can reconfigure existing spaces to accommodate the needs of the school and gain additional spaces, and have all of the students in one building, which makes heightened security measures more feasible.

But what is the benefit to the parish? Well, first of all, the RE program and adult religious education programs will have more space available to them in a renewed set of buildings. Guadalupe Hall now has four classrooms with as many desks as are needed for the middle school classes that meet in them. Moving the middle school to a new building would allow two large spaces to be made out of the four smaller spaces, which can then be used for adult religious education, ministries, programs and meetings. Because it would not be used for school, it would allow activities during the school day for the parish, and Croghan Hall and the PAC can be freed up for even more ministries and activities.

It's a win-win for Prince of Peace in every way. You will be hearing more about this from me in the near future. During Lent, we will have a weekend where we will have a possibility after every Mass to learn more about the project, and we will also have a quiet phase of fundraising for lead gifts. Eastertide is the current target for the active phase of the campaign, gathering pledges and commitments.

When 50% of the money is collected, and the rest pledged for this three-year campaign, we can begin construction. So the faster we get the first end of the phase done, the sooner we can enjoy the benefits of this expanded and remodeled space which we desperately need. Your generosity will help us, not only to attend to the needs of the present, but to generations of souls who call Prince of Peace their spiritual home.

I would ask that you already begin to think and pray in an intentional way about your tithe – that 10% that the Bible gives as our offering to God. At Prince of Peace, we suggest 5% go to the weekly operating offertory, 1% to the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina, and 4% to the charity of your choice. Give to those charities now, because very soon, we are going to ask you to consider that 4% going to this new campaign.

Not everybody can give the same amount, but everyone can give with the same spirit of sacrifice!

candlemas—2 february

Candlemas, also known as the Feast of Light, is a day of purification, renewal, and hope. On this day, exactly 40 days after Christmas, we commemorate Mary's obedience to Mosaic law by submitting herself to the Temple for the ritual of purification, as commanded in Leviticus 12:2-8.

This year Candlemas lands on a Sunday, 2 February. There will be blessing of candles at the 10a & 12p Masses. You may either bring your own candles to be blessed or you can get Candlemas candles from the parish office for \$5. The size of the candles are 8" and there are 2 in a box.

At the 10a Mass, there will be a choral Mass sung by the Youth Choir and motets sung by the Adult Choir

Candles to be blessed for 10a Mass are to be placed in the baskets in the Narthex. For 12p Mass, place candles on the table in the basket by the communion rail before Mass.

mothers of lu

In the year 1881 in a little village near Turin, Italy the mothers of the village, with the guidance of their priest, decided to gather together for a weekly hour of Eucharistic Adoration, Mass and community prayer. Their prayer was a simple one in which they asked God to grant to them an increase of vocations in their homes and parish. Through their prayers, a joy and deep piety developed in the homes of the families of Lu. Over a period of time from this tiny village came 323 vocations! There is a famous picture which was published in 1946 with many of these religious pictured on the steps of the church. St. John Bosco spent time in Lu and was the spiritual Father to Blessed Philip Rinaldi, of the Rinaldi family who experienced seven vocations. Our parish began to say this simple "Mothers of Lu" prayer after the 12n Mass more than 6 years ago. In that time, our parish has joyfully experienced 5 young men and women saying "yes" to a vocation to the religious life. There are a few more who are currently prayerfully considering joining the religious life as well. Parishioners from the 10a and 12p Masses gather at our Lady's altar after mass and say this Mother's of Lu prayer as a community. Some parishioners have also began to offer a weekly adoration hour as well. At Prince of Peace this prayer is not specifically for the mothers of our parish. We encourage anyone who wishes to join us at our Lady's altar after Mass as well as to encourage anyone who wishes to begin these prayers after the 5p (Sat) and 8a (Sun) Mass times. The prayers can be found in a bound folder placed on a small table to the right of the our Lady's altar.

Mothers of Lu Prayer at Prince of Peace:

O God, if it be Your will, please accept the sons and daughters of our Parish to serve you as priests and religious. Help us to live as good and holy Christians giving good example to them. Help us to guide the children of our parish to always do what is right so that they may receive the grace of God to become holy priests and religious, if it be Your Holy Will. Amen.



fr smith's lenten reading recommendation



This year marks the 1700th anniversary of the first of the 21 ecumenical councils of the Catholic Church, the First Council of Nicea. The Emperor Constantine called all of the bishops of the world to a meeting to develop a consensus on what the deposit of faith had to reveal about the divinity of Jesus Christ. Christians were divided amongst themselves because of the novel teaching of Arius that Jesus was not fully God, which provoked the censure of Saint Athanasius of Alexandria. The result of that meeting was a profession of faith called the Nicene Creed, which we pray every Sunday (albeit with a few additions from another ecumenical council, Constantinople I, from 381).

But where is Nicea today? Our parish has a long standing relationship with the Church in Turkey, specifically with the parish in Bursa, which is the closest Christian community near the site of ancient Nicea, known in Turkish as Iznik. Today, tourists go to Iznik to see the tremendously beautiful tile work produced by expert craftsmen. Christians will go and, when they find out that they are standing in the city of the first ecumenical council, will ask themselves where that historic event took place.

Mark Fairchild, a theology professor at Huntington University, was part of an archeological expedition underwater which found a basilica that matches all of the known data about the place the council was held. His book: The Underwater Basilica of Nicaea: Archaeology in the Birthplace of Christian Theology was released in November 2024. In this book, the Indiana Jones of the Primitive Church discusses the world where this council took place, how Christianity came to it and why the Emperor chose it, out of so many possible places, for a meeting that would change the course of Christian history. The discovery of an underwater church and royal meeting hall in 2014 and the daring research done about it has been one of the most groundbreaking events in archeological and theological history. How did it end up at the bottom of a lake, and what secrets does it yield about our Christian history that are relevant for today?

When we recite the Nicene Creed every Lord's Day, it's hard to envision where it came from, and sometimes, even why it has been such an important part of Christian belief and practice enduring over 1700 years! After reading this book as our parish Lenten reading, my hope is that, by learning more about our ancient Christian history near the place where we cooperate in mission, the Creed will come alive as a vital part of our worship!


