# Letter from our Pastor

# An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends,

There are four marks that set our school apart:

#### I. Intentional Catholicism

We don't happen to be Catholic. We breathe Catholic. Prince of Peace School is the principal apostolate of Prince of Peace Catholic Church for the transmission of the Catholic faith and the building up of a Catholic culture formed by worship, the quest for truth and in communion with the universal Church. Heaven, not this world, is the goal; formation for beatific vision. The heart of our school life is Holy Mass on Sundays as a parish family, and the center of the academic week is Holy Mass on Wednesdays as a school community.

Jesus said to him, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me". John 14.6

#### 2. Intellectual Rigor

The school blends the best of the old and the best of the new with a classical approach to the humanities and an innovative approach to the sciences. The curriculum is designed for children who want to be challenged by a rigorous curriculum and hard work. We look for growth by applying a disciplined approach to learning, and quantifiable results by testing and evaluation. The children are immersed in the Western intellectual tradition while simultaneously being open to creative and groundbreaking approaches to learning.

#### 3. Human Flourishing

Every child is made in the image and likeness of God, and the school is a ministry to facilitate the unleashing of each admitted child's potentialities. Respect for the child and integrating each child into a community of virtue and emotional intelligence helps build leaders for the future. Discreet accommodations and extra help for children who may struggle with certain aspects of the curriculum are provided in the context of a dialogue with the family. Truth, beauty and goodness inspire children to be who they are created by God to be; they are not just numbers, test results, or technocratic robots.

#### 4. Authentic Community

Our school is made of families from an incredibly diverse mosaic of ethnic, cultural and socioeconomic backgrounds who are selected after an admissions process because they are mission fit for authentic community in the school and church family. Families develop friendships and support networks that last far into the days when the profile of the graduate is reached at the consummation of an academic and cultural journey with us. Care for each other is inculcated at every level of the experience. The school is not an institution but an extension of the home, the domestic church.

#### fasting & abstaining

Every person between the age of 18 and 60 must fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Fridays of Lent are also days of required abstinence from meat.

#### The USCCB reminds us:

For members of the Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

All Fridays of the year are days of penitential abstinence, and in Lent this obligation is further focused and sharpened to help prepare our hearts for the mysteries of Easter.

#### lenten confession schedule

We are required to go to Confession and confess our mortal sins at least once a year, and go to Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter Season. This is called the Easter Duty.

#### ember days

There are four sets of three Ember Days, one for each season of the year. Ember comes from the Anglo-Saxon word for circuit, as they go through the circuit of the year and mark each temporal season with a fast of prayer. They have been observed in Rome since the 5th century. While they are no longer mandatory in the US, the Lenten Ember Days are celebrated on the Wednesday, Friday and Saturday of the Second Week of Lent.

They can be commemorated by fasting and abstinence from meat at one meal.

Dear Friends in Christ,

It wasn't all that long ago in Catholic parishes that the priests counted the collection on Sunday afternoon, went to the bank on Monday, and used the candle money as a discretionary fund for whatever Father thought was appropriate. That way of doing business may have served the Church well in a very different age, but those days are gone. Parishes today, especially with schools, now operate according to a nonprofit business model in South Carolina.

When you drop your money into the collection plate, at least two ushers who have been screened place the offertory together in a safe in the sacristy. The lay leadership every Monday does the count, goes to the bank, and submits the data to the Parish Finance Office. That office also processes online and other forms of giving information. Even on the off occasion that someone hands the priest an envelope, he makes sure that someone else sees him put it in the safe, or he involves someone else.

As the pastor, I have a credit card for gas, food, car expenses. An itemized list is submitted to the Finance Office every month, and anything outside of that is annotated with a letter explaining what it is for, so it can be assigned to the right account. The pastor has access to the accounts of the parish as the principal signatory, but we always have another signatory. I purposely do not have passwords to accounts, so that whenever we go to the bank, we have a small entourage from the staff to go in order to provide another layer of accountability and control. The Director of Administration and the Director of Finance are two separate people on the parish staff; they act as control mechanisms for the accounts. The Parish Finance Council also provides someone who checks the reconciliations.

Every parish has a threshold for an extraordinary act of administration, beyond which the votum of the Finance Council and approval of the Diocese is needed to engage in any financial transaction. Anything that involves a contract, which involves almost all larger ticket items, has to be approved by the Diocese before any expense can be made. This multilayered authority structure makes sure that no one person, whether it be the pastor, a staff member or a council member can arbitrarily spend any significant portion of income or make decisions that involve contracts apart from legal and financial oversight at a higher level.

The school's finances are administered directly by Parish Accounting Services at the Diocese. Because the school is the primary apostolate of the parish, yet another layer of administration, permissions, accountability and oversight is added to what the principal and the pastor can do on the ground in order to prevent any improper use of funds. There is a Finance Subcommittee of the School Advisory Council which meets monthly to prepare a budget for the school and monitors the school finances. Ultimately, the Parish Finance Council reviews and approves all the financial statements for both the parish and school.

Every quarter the Parish Finance Council receives, in advance, a full financial package a week before their meeting ensuring a more thorough review and productive meeting. They have the chance to meet with the Director of Administration, Director of Finance and the principal in advance with questions. At the meeting, all significant variances are explained. The principal presents the reports for the school, and there is always a member of the School Finance Subcommittee on the Parish Finance Council (PFC). Every year the members of the PFC sign off on a comprehensive checklist of safeguards to financial integrity.

The budgeting process begins with a collaboration between the parish staff on the church side and the faculty and administration on the school side. That process yields provisional numbers that are then worked into a budget by the Director of Administration and Director of Finance for the parish and the Principal working with the Director of Administration and the Director of Finance for the school. Every year, the PFC approves the budget and sees to its proper implementation every quarter with a comprehensive deep dive into all revenues and expenses.

This is a much more complicated process than the finance approach of yesteryear. It requires collaboration, consultation, checks and balances and constant analysis. It is a lot of work, but it is there to ensure that your investment in your parish is administered wisely. As we go into serious capital fundraising mode in 2025, I think it is important to take a moment to remind the parish about exactly how financial decisions are made at Prince of Peace. The higher the comfort level people have about how their gifts are used, the more likely they are to contribute to the important work of building the Kingdom of God here in Taylors.

# **Blessing of Pietà Sculpture**

# An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People



On Sunday, March 9, 2025, the First Sunday of Lent, Father Christopher Smith will bless a newly acquired Pietà sculpture at the beginning of the 12p Latin Mass. This beautiful work of art has been acquired in loving memory of Fiona Cunningham Simmons (1986–2015), the beloved daughter of Thomas and Patty Simmons and sister of Tommy Simmons. The Simmons family, parishioners since 2015, regularly attend the Latin Mass, and their gift reflects both their faith and their desire to honor their daughter's memory while offering solace to others.

The Pietà, a traditional Catholic depiction of the Virgin Mary cradling the lifeless body of her Son, Jesus Christ, after His crucifixion, is one of the most profound symbols in Catholic art and spirituality. It captures the sorrowful mystery of the Passion, embodying Mary's role as the Mater Dolorosa—the Sorrowful Mother—and her intimate participation in Christ's redemptive suffering. This particular sculpture, blessed during the penitential season of Lent, invites the faithful to meditate on sacrifice, loss, and the hope of the Resurrection, aligning deeply with the themes of this liturgical time.

In Catholic tradition, the Pietà also speaks to the universal experience of grief, particularly for parents who have lost a child. Just as Mary held her Son in an act of love and surrender to God's will, this sculpture stands as a testament to the enduring bond between parent and child, even in the face of unimaginable loss. It is a sacred space for reflection, prayer, and healing, resonating with the Church's call to unite personal suffering with Christ's own.

In keeping with the donors' intentions, this Pietà is dedicated not only to Fiona but to all parents who have endured the profound sorrow of losing a child. Father Christopher Smith and the parish extend a heartfelt invitation to such parents—whether parishioners or visitors—to come and visit this blessed sculpture. Bring your intentions, your memories, and your prayers to the foot of this image of Our Lady, who understands your pain more than anyone. Here, in the presence of the Sorrowful Mother and her Son, may you find comfort, strength, and the grace to carry your cross with hope.
