Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends,

If the nineteenth century was a century of incredible devotion to Our Lady, with shrines built at apparition sites all over the place, the twentieth century was in many ways the century of Saint Joseph. In the United States, it became very common for the two most prominent side altars flanking the main altar on the back wall to be Mary on one side and Joseph on the other. An Eastertide Sunday commemoration of the Last of the Patriarchs became the Feast of Saint Joseph on 19 March and the Memorial of Saint Joseph the Artisan, then renamed St Joseph the Worker on 1 May. Churches under the title of Saint Joseph sprang up all over the place.

Saint Teresa of Avila and her Carmelite Order's devotion to Saint Joseph seemed rather exotic in the 16th century. In our own time, Josephology has become a fixed part of theology curriculums in catholic faculties, albeit such a speculative one that I would surmise few of its proponents will ever see any of their theories recognized as authentic. The familiar image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary in some places is now being placed alongside the Paternal Heart of Joseph.

In an age in which masculinity is routinely excoriated as toxic, and families are disintegrating all over the place, many Christian men are wisely looking to Saint Joseph as a model, guide and intercessor. The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph has more than ever before taken pride of place in the consciousness of Catholics and with good reason. We need good men, good husbands and good fathers, and healthy families are hard to develop without them.

At Prince of Peace, we have often cultivated devotion to the Patron of the Universal Church and the Dying. In years past, we have often celebrated an evening Mass in English on that day, followed by a Procession over to the PAC for the Italian custom of the St Joseph's Table, with its blessing of bread, and a festive potluck meal to celebrate what in Catholic countries is Father's Day. Unfortunately, Greenville County Schools keeps scheduling spring break during the feast, and so my staff keeps telling me that it is unwise to try to plan a good feast of Saint Joseph in the middle of the school/work week like that. I cannot tell you how much I really dislike this. When we do a Daddy-Daughter Dance, it wouldn't matter when we did it, people would show up. As they should, because it is a beautiful occasion that makes memories for a lifetime, and underscores the very important relationship between fathers and daughters.

So why then is the model of fatherhood itself considered so unimportant that when I suggest celebrating his feast with the honor due to him, there is so much lack of enthusiasm? When we put first things first, everything else takes care of itself. Or am I missing something?

fasting & abstaining

Every person between the age of 18 and 60 must fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Fridays of Lent are also days of required abstinence from meat.

The USCCB reminds us:

For members of the Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

All Fridays of the year are days of penitential abstinence, and in Lent this obligation is further focused and sharpened to help prepare our hearts for the mysteries of Easter.

lenten confession schedule

We are required to go to Confession and confess our mortal sins at least once a year, and go to Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter Season. This is called the Easter Duty.

To My Family of Prince of Peace

In what has been an incredible, awesome and humbling experience, I cannot thank you enough for your love, support and prayers during the journey of my grandson, Ollie. From finding out in July that Ollie had a heart defect and would be born with struggles and needing surgeries to survive; to his birth on October 18, 2024; through 3 major heart surgeries; to his passing on February 20, 2025, my family of parishioners of Prince of Peace have been there with me and my family. For that I am forever grateful.

Although, no one ever got to meet Ollie, he became a part of your lives as you prayed for him, supported my family and loved us. Jesus only asked us to do two things: Love God and Love your neighbor. Believe me I have felt your love. I can see the love of Christ in you when you gave me your condolences. Jesus wept for his friend Lazarus. Like Jesus, we weep for our friend Ollie. The hurt will eventually lessen, but never pass. But knowing I have the family of Prince of Peace supporting me and my family, will make the road easier to travel.

Ollie accomplished so much for our Lord in his short four months. I hope I can be that productive the rest of my diaconate life. So many people from all denominations got on their

knees and prayed to our Lord for Ollie and my family. One of our goals in life should be to bring others to Christ. Ollie did that. Unfortunately, Ollie 's little body could not handle any more and he asked Poppa if he could come home. Poppa said yes, my good and faithful servant.

Please, do not stop praying. Please, continue to pray for the babies that are struggling to survive because of birth defects. Pray for their families to have the strength and fortitude to get through the road ahead. Pray for the doctors and nurses, faculties and staff of those facilities that care for our precious little one. They do their job with such love and affection. They get attached to the children and their families. I have witnessed the pain and hurt they experience as there is nothing more they can do for their precious little patients.

The head of the Children's Cardio NICU told us Ollie was writing his own story. He took turns they have never seen and he did things when he was ready. In their caring for Ollie, they have learned things that will help them give better care to future babies. Ollie's life on earth may have ended, but his job has not. Our pure, innocent boy is now a saint in heaven praying for all of you and interceding for all of us. Let's all live our lives doing what the Lord has asked us, so we can join Ollie in heaven. Thank you again for all your prayers, love and support during this journey. It is greatly appreciated.

God bless you & know that you are loved,


