Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends,

What are you doing on Friday nights at seven o'clock in the evening? If you're not at Stations of the Cross in your parish, I would suggest you need to really examine yourself as to why. How can we enter into Lent and not come together as a parish family to commemorate the Passion and Death of Our LORD? We already live in an age in which the fasting and abstinence required of most Catholics is laughable, and people think that giving up meat is an intolerable burden. Our Orthodox brothers and sisters have 180 fast days out of the year, most of them that don't allow fish, oil or dairy either.

When I see a church half empty for Stations during Lent, I am reminded of an episode in the life of St John Maximovitch, the Russian Orthodox Bishop of Shanghai and San Francisco (1896-1966). One Lenten Friday he was in his cathedral in California praying, and realized he was almost alone. Yet the noise of a band from next door was so loud that this habitually very recollected man could not even concentrate. In full vestments, he left the altar and went over to the dance hall to see a large group of his parishioners defiling the Lenten fast by raucous feasting and merriment. He just stood there in their midst, and broke down in tears. No judgment, no harangue, just the heart of a pastor moved to tears for the salvation of his flock. His holiness and willingness to challenge his people in this way was such that those people never did that on a Lenten day again!

One of his altar boys later wrote of him: His integrity in matters of the Church, and especially in matters of liturgical precision, indicate that his concern for his flock was not a matter of personal preference, but came out of the whole liturgical realm of Church services and the ecclesiastical philosophy of life, dogmatic and pastoral, which were a part of the apostolic succession preserved in Orthodoxy. He consciously lived in and operated from this otherworldly realm, formed historically by the Church Fathers, and thus he had a virtual disdain for the pragmatic expectations placed on one by the times and fashions. He was an enemy of fashion and gossip and pharisaical narrow-mindedness...

Once when I was serving in church, I entered the altar and Archbishop John pointed to my tie. I did not know what this meant. A boy then took me aside and told me to take off the tie because Archbishop John did not allow servers in the altar to have ties. I noticed that all the subdeacons also had no ties. Later I found out that the real reason why he would not allow ties in the altar was because a tie is a hanging-noose and represents death, while the altar represents heaven and life... Archbishop John never spoke in the altar. When something would go wrong he would only click his tongue as a sign that a correction was due. He would continue doing this until it was done right.

We can't pretend that the worship of God and the Lenten journey is just a frivolous option that doesn't really matter. If we do, the clergy indicate that it isn't important and doesn't have value. I am no Saint John Maximovitch, as you well know, and God knows I need more penance and mortification, not less of it. But can we at least try to start Lenting properly if we haven't been until now?

fasting & abstaining

Every person between the age of 18 and 60 must fast and abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. The Fridays of Lent are also days of required abstinence from meat.

The USCCB reminds us:

For members of the Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

All Fridays of the year are days of penitential abstinence, and in Lent this obligation is further focused and sharpened to help prepare our hearts for the mysteries of Easter.

lenten confession schedule

We are required to go to Confession and confess our mortal sins at least once a year, and go to Holy Communion at least once a year during the Easter Season. This is called the Easter Duty.

the annunciation of our lord

In England, this was known as Lady Day or Ladymass. Christmas is the day in which we celebrate the birth of the Prince of Peace, and nine months prior, on 25 March, we celebrate the conception of Jesus by the power of the Holy Spirit in the womb of the Virgin Mary at the annunciation of the Good News by the Archangel Gabriel.

In the current rubrics of the Mass, Annunciation and Christmas are the only two days that we genuflect instead of bow at the words in the Creed, "and became incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and was made man."

For many centuries, the start of the New Year was calculated, not from I January, the civil new year of the Roman Empire, but from today's feast. When this feast falls in Lent, we break from our Lenten penance to celebrate the Incarnation as a solemnity with no fast or abstinence. We sing the Gloria and the Creed at Mass.

In central Europe, farmers put an image of the Annunciation in grain silos and pray,

O Mary, we pray to you: Your life today with fruit was blessed. Give us happy promise, too, that our harvest will be of the best. If you protect and bless this field, a hundredfold each grain must yield.

mothers of lu

In the year 1881 in a little village near Turin, Italy the mothers of the village, with the guidance of their priest, decided to gather together for a weekly hour of Eucharistic Adoration, Mass and community prayer. Their prayer was a simple one in which they asked God to grant to them an increase of vocations in their homes and parish. Through their prayers, a joy and deep piety developed in the homes of the families of Lu. Over a period of time from this tiny village came 323 vocations! There is a famous picture which was published in 1946 with many of these religious pictured on the steps of the church. St. John Bosco spent time in Lu and was the spiritual Father to Blessed Philip Rinaldi, of the Rinaldi family who experienced seven vocations. Our parish began to say this simple "Mothers of Lu" prayer after the 12n Mass more than 6 years ago. In that time, our parish has joyfully experienced 5 young men and women saying "yes" to a vocation to the religious life. There are a few more who are currently prayerfully considering joining the religious life as well. Parishioners from the 10a and 12p Masses gather at our Lady's altar after mass and say this Mother's of Lu prayer as a community. Some parishioners have also began to offer a weekly adoration hour as well. At Prince of Peace this prayer is not specifically for the mothers of our parish. We encourage anyone who wishes to join us at our Lady's altar after Mass as well as to encourage anyone who wishes to begin these prayers after the 5p (Sat) and 8a (Sun) Mass times. The prayers can be found in a bound folder placed on a small table to the right of the our Lady's altar.

Mothers of Lu Prayer at Prince of Peace:

O God, if it be Your will, please accept the sons and daughters of our Parish to serve you as priests and religious. Help us to live as good and holy Christians giving good example to them. Help us to guide the children of our parish to always do what is right so that they may receive the grace of God to become holy priests and religious, if it be Your Holy Will. Amen.
