From Our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends,

We were delighted this year to welcome the largest group of adult converts by Baptism, Profession of Faith and Confirmation in years at the Easter Vigil. All over the world, Catholic churches presented record numbers of adults wanting to become Catholic Christians.

Yet, even as we celebrate these hopeful signs, we must confront some sobering realities. According to the Pew Research Center's 2023–24 Religious Landscape Study, for every 100 people who become Protestant, 180 leave. For every 100 people who enter the Catholic Church each year, 840 leave. Only 19% of Americans self-identify as Catholics in 2023-24, down from 24% in 2007; this is a 20% decrease over just fifteen years. Meanwhile, Muslims increased by an astounding 200%.

Turning our focus to Catholic education, data from the Center for Applied Research in the Apostolate (CARA) highlights the positive influence Catholic schooling has on faith retention. Among those who attended Catholic schools, 36% report still being Catholic and attending Mass weekly, with an additional 41% remaining Catholic but attending less frequently. In comparison, only 25% of Catholics who attended public schools remain Catholic and attend weekly Mass, with 44% remaining Catholic but attending less frequently.

These statistics make it clear: If we do not fully understand what, or rather, who, the Mass is, recognizing it as the source and summit of Christian life, our educational institutions risk losing their effectiveness as <took out the words "privileged" and "in trouble" when we talk about catholic education> vehicles for teaching the faith. Saint Jean-Marie Vianney, the patron saint of parish priests, once preached, "If we really understood what the Mass was, we would die." But we have accepted a situation in which Mass is so boring that we might as well die. When we return to Jesus Christ as the Way, the Truth and the Life and the sacraments of Baptism and the Eucharist as lived realities in every aspect of our parish community, then we have an incredible chance to reverse those statistics. It's hard to leave something if you truly know it and love it. But that means that everyone who calls Prince of Peace a spiritual home must be very intentional about making sure that every part of the fabric of our church, home and work life is permeated with the supernatural truths of our faith and are oriented first and foremost to the beatific vision.



mothers of lu

In the year 1881 in a little village near Turin, Italy the mothers of the village, with the guidance of their priest, decided to gather together for a weekly hour of Eucharistic Adoration, Mass and community prayer. Their prayer was a simple one in which they asked God to grant to them an increase of vocations in their homes and parish. Through their prayers, a joy and deep piety developed in the homes of the families of Lu. Over a period of time from this tiny village came 323 vocations! There is a famous picture which was published in 1946 with many of these religious pictured on the steps of the church. St. John Bosco spent time in Lu and was the spiritual Father to Blessed Philip Rinaldi, of the Rinaldi family who experienced seven vocations. Our parish began to say this simple "Mothers of Lu" prayer after the 12n Mass more than 6 years ago. In that time, our parish has joyfully experienced 5 young men and women saying "yes" to a vocation to the religious life. There are a few more who are currently prayerfully considering joining the religious life as well. Parishioners from the 10a and 12p Masses gather at our Lady's altar after mass and say this Mother's of Lu prayer as a community. Some parishioners have also began to offer a weekly adoration hour as well. At Prince of Peace this prayer is not specifically for the mothers of our parish. We encourage anyone who wishes to join us at our Lady's altar after Mass as well as to encourage anyone who wishes to begin these prayers after the 5p (Sat) and 8a (Sun) Mass times. The prayers can be found in a bound folder placed on a small table to the right of the our Lady's altar.

Mothers of Lu Prayer at Prince of Peace:

O God, if it be Your will, please accept the sons and daughters of our Parish to serve you as priests and religious. Help us to live as good and holy Christians giving good example to them. Help us to guide the children of our parish to always do what is right so that they may receive the grace of God to become holy priests and religious, if it be Your Holy Will. Amen.

esto vir—a men's ministry
