From our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

There are many laws in the church which are of divine origin (that marriage is between one man and one woman for life), and others which are disciplinary in nature which are related to doctrine or tradition and can only be changed by the Pope (think the celibacy of the clergy). Some disciplines are delegated by the Roman Pontiff to the national conference of bishops (like which holy days are of obligation). Then there are disciplines which admit of dispensations (like when bishops dispense from fasting and abstinence on a Friday when it falls on Saint Patrick's Day, which is not a solemnity). Then there are disciplines which a pastor can dispense from (like the policy that a couple needs to be registered and active in the parish for at least six months before beginning wedding preparation) which are more policy-oriented, but rooted in the discipline of the Church. As Catholics, we live out our communion within the Church aware of the various levels of the laws of the Church which are not there to restrict grace but to ensure its fruitfulness.

I tend to be of the idea that if someone comes to me and asks for a dispensation from an ecclesiastical discipline which is within my power to grant, that, as long as there is a spiritual reason for it and it's not just "gaming the system," then the freedom of the children of God demands that I not add burdens to people who have the presence of mind and soul to ask. But that liberality does not bind any other pastor.

When it comes to the sacrament of confirmation, the Bishop is the ordinary minister of the sacrament in the Latin Church. The rich and complex system of disciplines around the sacrament are meant to protect that vital link between the successors to the apostles and the sacraments of initiation. Some of those disciplines affect validity. For example, if I try to confirm someone under the age of 16 without the expressly given faculty to do so, and they are not literally dying, it is not only illicit but invalid. Others are meant to safeguard the integrity of the sacramental economy and admit of dispensations in theory for the spiritual good of the person, but are normally reserved to danger of death situations. I do not have the authority to grant dispensations in this realm because they are reserved to the Bishop.

Recently, there have been so many requests from parishioners at Prince of Peace for dispensations for various things related to confirmation that I was reprimanded by my superiors for the sheer volume of them. Remember that the disciplines are there for a reason, and the Church has been doing confirmations for, well, 2000 years. But in an age in which so many people feel entitled to a participation trophy for breathing, even in the Church there has developed this worrying tendency towards a sense of entitlement even for dispensations from ecclesiastical discipline. Because the only place in the diocese this is happening is Prince of Peace, my superiors have instructed me that, when it comes to the sacrament of confirmation, there will be no such dispensations outside of danger of death.

I think it is a chance to remind everyone that there is something beautiful about just observing what the Church normally observes. You don't need a godparent who is under the age required by canon law, you don't have to receive confirmation in only one specific form of the rite, you don't have to receive a sacrament at an age earlier than what the Church deems necessary. Let's stop trying to be eccentric and special and just be normal, let's respect the disciplines and conform to them in a spirit of obedience and communion.



mothers of lu

In the year 1881 in a little village near Turin, Italy the mothers of the village, with the guidance of their priest, decided to gather together for a weekly hour of Eucharistic Adoration, Mass and community prayer. Their prayer was a simple one in which they asked God to grant to them an increase of vocations in their homes and parish. Through their prayers, a joy and deep piety developed in the homes of the families of Lu. Over a period of time from this tiny village came 323 vocations! There is a famous picture which was published in 1946 with many of these religious pictured on the steps of the church. St. John Bosco spent time in Lu and was the spiritual Father to Blessed Philip Rinaldi, of the Rinaldi family who experienced seven vocations. Our parish began to say this simple "Mothers of Lu" prayer after the 12n Mass more than 6 years ago. In that time, our parish has joyfully experienced 5 young men and women saying "yes" to a vocation to the religious life. There are a few more who are currently prayerfully considering joining the religious life as well. Parishioners from the 10a and 12p Masses gather at our Lady's altar after mass and say this Mother's of Lu prayer as a community. Some parishioners have also begun to offer a weekly adoration hour as well. At Prince of Peace this prayer is not specifically for the mothers of our parish. We encourage anyone who wishes to join us at our Lady's altar after Mass as well as to encourage anyone who wishes to begin these prayers after the 5p (Sat) and 8a (Sun) Mass times. The prayers can be found in a bound folder placed on a small table to the right of our Lady's altar.

Mothers of Lu Prayer at Prince of Peace:
