An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

When Father Smith asked me to write a bulletin column on “what is it like to be in a school that is so Catholic,” I smiled because it brings to mind the essential question, “what makes Catholic education different from secular education?” If our parish school, if any Catholic school, isn’t “so Catholic” why bother having a parish school at all? So, what is it like to be in a school that is “so Catholic?” The best way to find out is to schedule a tour and see for yourself! But let me give you a little idea of what it is like to be at 1209 Brushy Creek 180 days of the year.

Being in a school that is “so Catholic” is to be in a place where Christ isn’t a guest—He’s the host. His presence fills our classrooms, guides our discipline, shapes our curriculum, and animates our community. From morning prayers to the Angelus at noon, from weekly school Masses to spontaneous conversations about the saints, I strive to make sure our students are not just informed about the Faith, but formed by it.

Being in a school that is “so Catholic” is a daily encounter with the “Good Shepherd” (John 10:11), a place where the dignity of every child is honored—not because of grades or talents, but because each and every student is made in the Imago Dei. We don’t just teach students how to succeed in this life; we prepare them for the next. That means cultivating virtues like courage, charity, perseverance, and humility right alongside reading and math.

Being in a school that is “so Catholic” also means that joy and reverence are part of the daily rhythm. It’s not unusual to hear the laughter of children on the playground right before they line up reverently to enter the church for Adoration, living the call to “let the little children come unto me” (Matthew 19:14) is a daily reality at Prince of Peace.

Being in a school that is “so Catholic” is being in a place where the words of Pope Paul VI are taken very seriously: “modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses.” (Evangelii Nuntiandi). Being at Prince of Peace is being in a school where every teacher is a witness to, “the Way, the Truth, and the Life” (John 14:6) rather than in a school which echoes Pontius Pilate and stops with indifference, with a shrug, and rhetorically says, “what is truth?” (John 18:38).

Being in a school that is “so Catholic” is being in a place where teachers don’t have to set faith aside when they walk into the classroom, but in a place where they’re called to live it out fully. Our parish school gives our faculty the ability to teach with the mind of the church, by recognizing that, “Catholic education is also evangelization: bearing witness to the joy of the Gospel and its power to renew our communities and provide hope and strength in facing wisely the challenges of the present time.” (Pope Francis, Message to the GRACE Delegation).

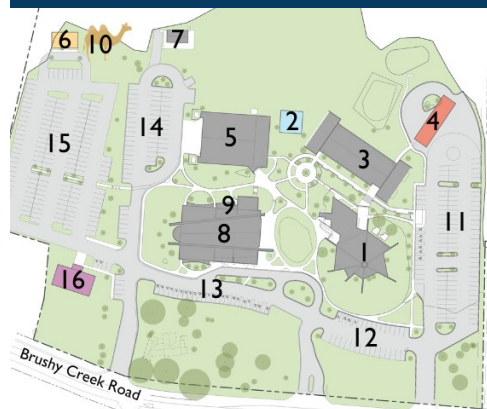
More than anything, being at a school that is “so Catholic” means being in a place where our students are surrounded by the truth of the Gospel and the love of Christ every day. In a world that too often sows confusion and distraction, our school strives to be a place of clarity and peace—a little workshop for the soul, where saints in the making grow day by day.

What’s it like to be in a school that’s “so Catholic?” It’s a daily reminder that education is a sacred task, and that we are all—students, parents, teachers, and administrators—pilgrims on the road to Heaven.

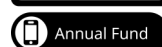

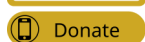

Richard Tomlinson** as spiritual director. This 10-day pilgrimage will immerse travelers in the sacred geography of our faith, offering daily Mass, guided visits to holy sites, and time for prayer and reflection.

Pilgrims will visit Bethlehem, Nazareth, the Sea of Galilee, and Jerusalem—praying at the Church of the Nativity, renewing wedding vows at Cana, walking the Via Dolorosa, and celebrating Mass at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. The itinerary also includes Mount Tabor, the Mount of Beatitudes, the Jordan River, and even a chance to float in the Dead Sea. The pilgrimage will be offered in prayer for **Sister Philip Marie Burle**, and special intentions, including prayers for life, expectant mothers, and the faithful departed, will be incorporated throughout.

This thoughtfully planned journey includes round-trip airfare from Newark, hotel accommodations, most meals, entrance fees, ground transportation, and an English-speaking guide. It's designed to be spiritually enriching while also accommodating the practical needs of travelers. Participants should be prepared for moderate walking and moments of profound encounter with Scripture and tradition.

we’re hiring—finance & accounting manager

Prince of Peace Catholic Church and School in Taylors, SC, is seeking a full-time, exempt Finance & Accounting Manager to handle the financial, accounting, and human resource operations for both parish and school. The individual in this role will work closely with the Director of Administration, Principal, and Pastor and must be highly organized, detail-oriented, and committed to confidentiality.

Parish Responsibilities include processing accounts payable and receivable, reconciling accounts, managing payroll through ADP, preparing monthly and quarterly financial reports, entering and tracking donations in Flocknote, and assisting with budget development and reporting. The Manager will attend staff meetings and quarterly meetings of the Parish Finance Council, helping prepare the annual parish financial report.

School Responsibilities include handling accounts payable, preparing checks, reconciling credit card and other accounts, and assisting in the budgeting process using Martus. The Manager will help ensure smooth transitions between accounting software systems, assist with reporting for Diocesan requirements, and attend quarterly Finance Subcommittee meetings of the School Advisory Council.

This role requires in-office work Monday through Friday (40 hours/week) and professional attire. Candidates must have a degree in finance or accounting and relevant payroll experience. Familiarity with Sylogist, Flocknote, and Martus is a plus. Practicing Catholics are strongly preferred due to the nature of the work with parishioner records and donor stewardship.
