An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

Fyodor Dostoevsky's classic novel *The Idiot* has one of my favorite lines of dialogue. Brief and sublime, we read that, "beauty will save the world." In Dostoevsky's work, anything eternal and true is shown in sharp relief by juxtaposing it against suffering and evil. In a world determined to fashion newer and more grotesque forms of brutality and sorrow, the light of beauty shows the way to truth and hope. It primes our souls for the reality that God is *good* and that in his goodness he has a plan for us.

In 2006, the Pontifical Council for Culture (now part of the Dicastery for Culture and Education) published a document which highlights the role of beauty in the process of evangelism. The document, aptly titled *Via Pulchridinis, Privileged Pathway for Evangelization and Dialogue,* reminds us that

The beauty of the liturgy... is first of all the deep beauty of the meeting with the mystery of God, present among men through the intermediary work of the Son, "the fairest of the children of men" ... It expresses the beauty of the communion with Him and with our brothers, the beauty of a harmony which translates into gestures, symbols, words, images and melodies that touch the heart and the spirit and raise marvel and the desire to meet the resurrected Lord, ... the Door of Beauty.

Prince of Peace is committed to the *Via Pulchritudinis*, or Way of Beauty. If you've spent any time here at all, you'll know what I mean. We take care in the celebration of the Mass and we have a deep awareness of the impact of aesthetics on the formation of our people. This is true in the encouragement we give to families in the formation of children, and in the small things that so many here do to offer, above all else, the sublime Mystery of the Eucharist in the Beauty of Holiness.

As Catholics, we believe that the Source and Summit of our faith is the Eucharist. We believe that God Himself, through the Mystery of the Eucharist, gives Himself to us so that we can come into deeper union with Him. There is truly nothing more beautiful on Earth than this reality.

While our goal in the formation of souls is found in encountering Christ in the Sacrifice of the Mass, we are also dedicated to nurturing men, women, and children to live out their vocation with joy and holiness. We offer classes, lectures, and a number of ministry opportunities for people to roll up their sleeves and join in proclaiming the gospel in both word and deed.

I want to encourage you to invite your friends and family, whether they are practicing Catholics or not, to join you in Mass here at Prince of Peace. Allow the Holy Spirit to undo the knots in their hearts as they are confronted with, as the old gospel hymn from my youth proclaims, that 'Love which will not let them go.'

If you are hungry for a deeper faith, dream of serving Christ through your vocation, or are simply struggling to make sense of the message of the Gospel in a difficult season, you are in the right place. The pilgrimage will be offered in prayer for **Sister Philip Marie Burle**, and special intentions, including prayers for life, expectant mothers, and the faithful departed, will be incorporated throughout.

This thoughtfully planned journey includes round-trip airfare from Newark, hotel accommodations, most meals, entrance fees, ground transportation, and an English-speaking guide. It's designed to be spiritually enriching while also accommodating the practical needs of travelers. Participants should be prepared for moderate walking and moments of profound encounter with Scripture and tradition.

Prince of Peace Catholic Church and School in Taylors, SC, is seeking a full-time, exempt Finance & Accounting Manager to handle the financial, accounting, and human resource operations for both parish and school. The individual in this role will work closely with the Director of Administration, Principal, and Pastor and must be highly organized, detail-oriented, and committed to confidentiality.

Parish Responsibilities include processing accounts payable and receivable, reconciling accounts, managing payroll through ADP, preparing monthly and quarterly financial reports, entering and tracking donations in Flocknote, and assisting with budget development and reporting. The Manager will attend staff meetings and quarterly meetings of the Parish Finance Council, helping prepare the annual parish financial report.

School Responsibilities include handling accounts payable, preparing checks, reconciling credit card and other accounts, and assisting in the budgeting process using Martus. The Manager will help ensure smooth transitions between accounting software systems, assist with reporting for Diocesan requirements, and attend quarterly Finance Subcommittee meetings of the School Advisory Council.

This role requires in-office work Monday through Friday (40 hours/week) and professional attire. Candidates must have a degree in finance or accounting and relevant payroll experience. Familiarity with Sylogist, Flocknote, and Martus is a plus. Practicing Catholics are strongly preferred due to the nature of the work with parishioner records and donor stewardship.

Please register early. Classes will begin 17 August, with a parent meeting in the PAC after dropping students off in their classrooms. One parent MUST attend the meeting per family.

If you chose to homeschool your child(ren) and are teaching religion at home, please fill out a Homeschool RE Registration Form and turn it into Maria Barontini. This serves as a record for sacramental preparation and is needed YEARLY. The parish needs records for two full years for First Holy Communion AND two years of records for Confirmation preparation. Please do not come to the parish office expecting your child to receive a sacrament immediately without proper records and attendance at mandatory sacramental events/ meetings. The homeschool RE Registration Form outlines the requirements for each sacrament for our homeschooling families. ALL First Holy Communion YEAR 2 and Confirmation YEAR 2 registration forms must be turned in prior to the yearly December deadline for a child to participate in a spring sacrament.


