#### An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

#### Dear Parishioners,

When Father asked me to share about our communications strategy "ad intra and ad extra," I began by reflecting on how blessed I am to serve this extraordinary community as your Communications Director. What started as Father's request to grow our social media has evolved into something I never imagined possible.

Father's initiative quickly revealed deeper communications challenges-fragmented information across platforms, a website needing streamlining, and the realization that effective external outreach required solid internal foundations. My first thought was that a picture could do more good than any words I could assemble into a paragraph, leading me to buy my first camera to capture our liturgical beauty. Many of you parishioners became my first subjects behind the lens. As our social media grew, reformatting our bulletin and creating The Cardinal's Good News newsletter became natural next steps-modernizing design throughout because beauty is critical in reflecting God. You can't authentically share your community's story externally until you're telling it well internally.

Today, our approach centers on comprehensive, consistent resources serving both our internal parish family (ad intra) and external outreach (ad extra). Our weekly bulletin remains the gold standard-everything you need in one place. The Cardinal's Good News celebrates students while keeping school parents informed. When emergencies arise or major liturgical seasons approach, we supplement with targeted communications, but the goal remains: no one should hunt for information.

Our external communications tell a connected story that protects and promotes our parish brand. Our social media reach now exceeds 300,000 monthly impressions-amazing growth from our humble beginnings. But numbers only matter when they serve souls. We've evolved from simply announcing events to creating genuinely evangelical content that reflects our mission. Our "The More You Know" series explains our beautiful ceremonies-why we use incense, what liturgical gestures mean, the theology behind our traditions. We share stories of parishioners discovering the Real Presence. Recent reels feature homily clips directing people to our full podcast library.

This isn't about trying to be Catholic News Agency or EWTN, covering every piece of Church news. Instead, we're responding to a beautiful reality: people discover Prince of Peace online and choose to join our community. Many OCIA participants began by stumbling across our content-maybe hearing a homily online to "test drive" which church to attend, or seeing shared posts that sparked curiosity about the Catholic faith.

Our recognition-repeatedly winning Best of the Upstate for both "Place of Worship" (originally "Best Online Church Service")-validates our strategic approach and reflects who we are as a community. We're formal yet welcoming, liturgically beautiful yet accessible, extraordinary in our ordinariness. We have a special gift for welcoming young families-parents know their crying babies are a sign the church is growing and are welcome and wanted in our sanctuary. And yes, sometimes we share a dash of humor too.

Our COVID livestreaming journey captures this evolution perfectly. We started with a cell phone and some borrowed lighting and built a complete audio-visual experience serving families near and far. We even have a devoted online parishioner in California who became so connected to our community during 2020 that she donated the blue vestments our religious wear for Marian feasts! Every upgrade serves our mission of making liturgical beauty accessible to all, especially our VIPs-the homebound.

Here's what I need from you: your engagement amplifies our reach and impact. When you like, share, and comment on our content, you're actively participating in evangelization while helping maintain our positive digital reputation. You're helping someone scrolling through Facebook discover what we know: Prince of Peace is a community worth joining.

Our private parish Facebook group serves internal peer connection for prayer requests and service needs beautifully, but our public presence depends on your willingness to celebrate your faith community openly. Every authentic share could be someone's first glimpse of Catholic life or their introduction to our parish school. Every thoughtful comment could spark a conversation leading someone home to the Church or prompting a family to schedule a school tour. Every positive interaction reinforces our reputation as a welcoming, vibrant parish and an excellent educational community.

Photography taught me to see beauty everywhere-in First Communion smiles, light streaming through windows during Adoration, joy on faces during parish celebrations, and yes, even the occasional expressive priestly moment. These authentic scenes deserve capturing, sharing, and remembering because they tell our true story.

Thank you for trusting me with stewarding our parish's voice and image, both to ourselves and to the world watching. Across Father Smith's travels, he consistently encounters people who know our parish-and that makes my heart so happy. In a time when many wonder if the Church offers anything meaningful, we get to show them-through strategic communications, beautiful imagery, and authentic witness-that Prince of Peace is indeed where souls find their home.

#### journey to the holy land

Please register early. Classes will begin 17 August, with a parent meeting in the PAC after dropping students off in their classrooms. One parent MUST attend the meeting per family.

If you chose to homeschool your child(ren) and are teaching religion at home, please fill out a Homeschool RE Registration Form and turn it into Maria Barontini. This serves as a record for sacramental preparation and is needed YEARLY. The parish needs records for two full years for First Holy Communion AND two years of records for Confirmation preparation. Please do not come to the parish office expecting your child to receive a sacrament immediately without proper records and attendance at mandatory sacramental events/meetings. The homeschool RE Registration Form outlines the requirements for each sacrament for our homeschooling families. ALL First Holy Communion YEAR 2 and Confirmation YEAR 2 registration forms must be turned in prior to the yearly December deadline for a child to participate in a spring sacrament.
