### Letter from our Pastor

### AnExtraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

Many of our older folk remember a time when parents would "divide and conquer" at Mass. Mom would go to the early Mass with the older kids while Dad stayed at home with the little ones, and then Dad would go to the later Mass, and they would all meet up for the rest of the day as family time. That strategy worked for many families. Today, many of our younger families insist on the importance of the entire family being united around the altar at Mass and getting the children used to being in church from their earliest moments. In an age where families and marriages are disintegrating all over the place, I find this a very spiritually mature development coming from a very good place. But of course, sometimes we have single parents or one parent has to bring all the kids to Mass because another parent has to work or is sick. And children are, well children. Some parents are terrified that their child will be disruptive and are apprehensive about coming. Others think their children should free range in God's house like they do in their own house. And most parents are somewhere in the middle: we come, we try our best, and do what we need to do for our own kids and try to be attentive of the needs of those around us. There's no clear blueprint for how to do this, but everyone has an opinion on how it should be done. And then we have children with unique challenges and needs and their parents are torn between advocating for their children and trying to live as normal a life as possible.

Then we have the fact that the church is a sacred space. There are norms of behaviour that are appropriate for the silence and prayerful environment for divine worship. Sometimes we have older people who, like our younger parents, often struggle to get to Mass, and they want to follow the Mass because it is their lifeline to God and sometimes one of the few experiences of community they have. The church has to be both a place that welcomes everyone and at the same time upholds a sense of the sacred and the beautiful.

Expectations are what they are, and opinions flow freely, and sometimes, in our worship places, iron sharpens iron, and sparks fly. We have had older parishioners leave the parish because they felt undervalued and under-represented in such a growing parish, and younger parishioners leave the parish because they felt judged and unjustly reproved for the behavior of their children at Mass. Not even Solomon in all his wisdom could provide a solution which would be acceptable to everyone, and most priests won't even touch this issue because he will inevitably get the hate mail from everyone about it.

But here's my take, and you can hate all you want. The confession times are in the bulletin. Jesus said, Let the little children come to Me. Children are not the future of the Church, they are the present, and as baptized Christians, they are saints. Their hymn of praise might not sound as melodious as that of our amazing choirs at times, but it is a gift. If it ain't cryin', it's dyin', as more than priest talks about the Church. I wish that instead of taking to social media to complain and having snippy or degrading conversations in the church, that our young families and our older parishioners could get to know each other better, that the young would be more open to listening to the wisdom of parents who have survived that stage in their lives, and that the seasoned would be patient and, in appropriate ways, offer to help. Come to coffee hour and introduce yourselves to each other. Smile and offer words of encouragement.

One of the greatest blessings of our church building is that there are various "escape hatches" for parents. The Quiet Room (I know that is a very aspirational name for what I refuse to call the Cry Room), the narthex and the outdoor spaces in good weather, are great options. I know some families are reticent to use them, because they want to access as much of the Mass as they can; but the way you participate in Mass in this stage if your life is going to look different now, and that's okay. It's okay to exercise the freedom of the children of God to do what you need to do. And if someone else doesn't understand that or thinks you should do it in a different way, don't let it rob your interior peace. We are a 100% pro-life church, and if the increasing numbers of marriages and baptisms and enrolment in school and RE are any indication, the sounds of young saints are going to praise God from this place for a long time. May we all thank God for that!
