Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

I am not a fan of the question, How often should I go to confession? The Church requires you to go to confession at least once a year if you are in the state of mortal sin. Our faith teaches us that if you die in the state of unrepented mortal sin, you send yourself to hell. It seems perfectly reasonable, then, to go to confession as soon as you can, because, you know neither the day nor the hour. Some spiritual directors like to suggest a time frame, like once a month or so. And we read the lives of the saints and read about people like St John Paul II who went to confession every day. There are those who think that, "I take a bath every Saturday whether I need it or not," and so they have a regular habit at predictable intervals of going. I think that the freedom of the children of God means that, you should absolutely go to confession at the first reasonable opportunity if you are in the state of mortal sin, and that, if you got time to sin, you got time to wait in a line that might be slightly inconvenient. Other than that, a reasonable interval of time under the influence of prayer to develop a healthy habit of regular confession, even of venial sins, is a great spiritual practice.

But you have to be careful to not develop an attitude of entitlement towards the sacrament of confession. Confession is not an on-demand concierge service. If you begin to think, "I'm just going to pop into confession for a quick absolution", are you really seeing the sacrament of penance as a prayerful encounter with your own conscience and the mercy of God, or are you making it transactional: I sin, I confess, I'm good, and the only thing that you adopt as a spiritual practice is the act of confessing, and not the celebration of the sacrament in the context of growing in virtue and all of those disciplines of the spiritual life that bring us close to Jesus. Sometimes people rationalize this as "I just want the graces," in the most appallingly mathematical kind of way, as if "more is more." The grace of Jesus Christ absolves, purifies and sanctifies not just in the act of confessing, but in the entire Christian life of grace.

There are some people who go to confession quite frequently because, well, they keep falling into mortal sin, and they know it, God knows it, and they come to the medicine of immortality with hope and decision to not sin again. But then there are those who are fixed on the act of confessing to the total or partial exclusion of the firm resolve to not sin again part. There are those who are tormented by guilt for sins of the past, and think that obsessively mentioning them over and over again is somehow going to convince God to forgive them, when he did that on the Cross 2000 years ago! (that is different than calmly mentioning a sin from the past in confession to pray for the grace of deeper healing from the effects of that already forgiven sin). There are those who let the Devil steal their interior peace by agonizing, "I am not sure if this is a mortal sin or not," when mortal sin by its nature means that you know full well that it is a mortal sin. While you certainly can mention struggles and imperfections and minor faults in the confessional, are you doing it in a repetitive and transactional way, or a disciplined and hopeful way? And finally, are you mindful of the many people behind you in line when you couch your confession in a narrative that may make a good telenovela, but not a good confession?

A healthy attitude towards the sacrament of confession means that every day you do an examination of conscience, you go as soon as you can for mortal sins, at regular intervals for other stuff, and that you have confidence in God's love for you that His Providence will arrange the right encounters with His Mercy at the right time, whether in the confession or in some other beautiful way. Scrupulosity is often a spiritual manifestation of obsessive-compulsive disorder, and when you are battling that challenge, more is not more when it comes to confession. www.scrupulousanonymous.org is a treasure trove of riches that I wish more people, even who don't think they suffer from scruples, would use. Check it out!




national day of remembrance


