Letter from our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

Last week in the bulletin column we put in the policy on being considered an active parishioner at Prince of Peace. We need everyone who calls Prince of Peace their spiritual home to be here, to use the envelope system to track attendance, and support the work of the Church with prayer and money. We often talk about the Biblical tithe: 10%, and suggest the following formula.

10% Tithe is broken down as:

5% to the Parish Weekly Offertory

1% to the Catholic Appeal of South Carolina (the Bishop's appeal)

4% to the Charity of your choice

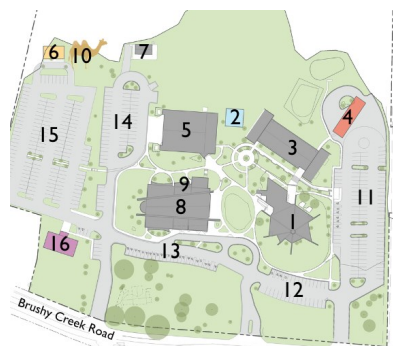
Today is a good day to prayerfully consider how you structure your giving. On the weekend of 8-9 November, you will have an opportunity on Saturday at 6.30p and Sunday at 11.30a to come to Parish House for a presentation on the new Capital Campaign for facilities expansion called *Peace in Progress* which will expand our present facilities for educational and ministry opportunities. We ask all of you to be present for one of these two meetings to learn more about how Prince of Peace will progress into the future. We will be asking you to keep up your present giving to the operating offertory and to consider making the campaign the destination of that 4% for the duration of the campaign.

When we have 50% of the money collected and the rest pledged, we can begin building, and so we are going to ask everyone who calls Prince of Peace their spiritual home to make as sacrificial a gift as they can make this November as we begin to wind down our 50th anniversary celebrations, so that we can chart the course for the next 50 years.

The parish is also working with FlockNote, a parish-based data management company, for our records as well as the management of the capital campaign funds. Keep your eyes peeled to the bulletin for more information on that, because we need everyone to participate in this most important work for the future.

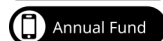

Masses to pray for the souls of the just being purified for the vision of God will follow our regular Sunday schedule. In the Extraordinary Form, All Souls Day is transferred to Monday, 3 November, with Latin Mass at 7p.

To honor the feast, the St. Cecilia Choir will present Johann Caspar Kerll's Missa pro defunctis ("Mass for the Dead") at the 10a English Mass on Sunday, 2 November, and again at the 7p Latin Mass on Monday. Scored for choir, soloists, three violas, and organ, this contemplative Baroque Requiem—admired by Pachelbel, Handel, and Bach—offers a moving musical tribute to the faithful departed.

Each registered household received **two** All Souls envelopes in the September/October packet. Please write the names of your beloved deceased on one and place it in the offertory during October; these names will rest on the Altar through November. The second envelope is for your Sunday offering. To have the name of a loved one who has died since All Souls Day 2024 read before Mass, contact the parish office. (Those with funerals here are already included.)

The St. Joseph Altar will feature candles for parishioners who died since last year. Candles may be picked up beginning 1 December. A vase of white roses will remember all miscarried babies, with a single red rose in memory of those lost to abortion.

Our All Souls Novena will be in the "How to Help Send Souls to Heaven" packet available in the 18–19 October bulletin. The Novena begins 25 October.
