From Our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Today we commemorate the Feast of the Holy Family, and so the feast normally celebrated on the 28th of December, Holy Innocents, drops out because it is a Sunday. But I think it is a great opportunity to see in the juxtaposition of these two feasts to remember the innocent ones, the children.

The Innocents of Herod's time were in danger because they stood in the way of totalitarian domination by an earthly king who had become paranoid because of his own sin. How many children today are also in danger for so many reasons? Although Catholic teaching traditionally provides criteria for just war, those criteria are drawn around military targets and the avoidance of killing innocent people. But there are wars all over the world, and children are the greatest victims. We cannot stand by in silence and overlook the poor treatment of children because of the machinations of politicians. Children today all over the world are still threatened by violence, injustice, discrimination and poverty. As people of faith, we have to work for justice to overcome those structures of sin against life, as well as avoid personal individual sins against hope.

In our own context, children also have existential threats that we cannot be naïve or ignorant about. One of the most dangerous places for a child to be, still, is the womb. Abortion has not gone away, and the psychological effects of abortion on mothers and fathers and other family members, and the unresolved grief that comes from the murder of the innocent, is warping our society. Children also have heightened threats from gender ideology, moral relativism, sexual, physical and emotional abuse, and predators online. Greenville is a hot spot for human trafficking, which means under very own noses, children are bondaged into slavery right up and down I-85 every day. Parents are sometimes incredibly disconnected from the disastrous consequences of their children's early exposure to pornography, excessive screen time and what is really going on in their classrooms.

There are a lot of Herods nowadays, and sometimes they lurk in our very own families. Let us protect the innocence of childhood, and give children opportunities to thrive in communities of love and respect. We urge every parent of school aged children to call the school next week and arrange for a visit to the school and consider Catholic education for their children, to help them hide from Herod for a little while longer!



The Blessing of Epiphany Water will take place on Monday, 5 January at 7p. This rite consists solely of the traditional blessing of water according to the Roman Ritual; there will be no Mass that evening. The blessed water may be taken home and used throughout the year as a sacramental for the blessing of homes and families, recalling both the Baptism of the Lord and the sanctification of all creation by Christ. Please place the water you want blessed inside the altar rail (Main Altar) prior to Mass beginning and pick it up after.


