From Our Pastor



An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Parishioners,

The Feast of the Epiphany proclaims a great and enduring truth: God desires to be known. He does not remain hidden or distant. He reveals Himself—not in spectacle or force, but in humility. The eternal Son of God is made manifest to the world as a child, laid in a manger, entrusted to a mother's care. Divinity enters human history quietly, yet decisively.

The Gospel tells us that wise men from distant lands saw a star and set out in search of what they did not yet fully understand. They were not driven by curiosity, but by longing. They were seeking Someone. When they arrived, they did not analyze or debate. They fell to their knees and adored. They recognized that this was no ordinary child, but the King of Kings and Lord of Lords.

That same Lord continues to make Himself known to us today, most especially in the Holy Eucharist. At every Mass, Christ is lifted up upon the altar, fulfilling His promise: "When I am lifted up, I will draw all people to myself." What appears as simple bread and wine is, in truth, the Body and Blood of the Savior. This is the great Epiphany of our time: God giving Himself entirely to His people.

Because this gift is so extraordinary, it calls forth a response. If Christ gives Himself to us so completely, what do we give in return?

The Magi opened their treasures and offered gold, frankincense, and myrrh—gifts fit for a king, a priest, and a sacrifice. They understood that everything they possessed had first been given to them by God, and yet they offered it back freely. Their gifts were an act of worship, a sign of surrender.

We are invited to bring our own gifts to the altar: the gold of obedience, choosing God's will over our own; the incense of prayer and reverence, lifting our hearts toward heaven; and the myrrh of repentance, offering sorrow for our sins and trust in God's mercy. These are the treasures Christ desires.

Such gifts require humility. Before the Eucharistic Lord, there is no room for pride or self-sufficiency. For centuries, Catholics have knelt in adoration not as a mere custom, but as a bodily confession of faith. Even when we cannot kneel with our bodies, we must kneel with our hearts, recognizing that we stand before God Himself.

It is easy, in a distracted world, to lose sight of what happens at Mass. Yet nothing there is ordinary. Heaven touches earth. The angels themselves marvel at what is entrusted to us: the privilege of receiving Christ into our very bodies. This is not a routine encounter. It is a moment of divine intimacy.

Epiphany calls us to see again, to lift our eyes to the star that still shines above the altar, to rejoice at the Lord who comes to meet us, and to adore Him with renewed love. Christ continues to reveal Himself to those who seek Him with humility and faith.

May we, like the Magi, set aside all that holds us back, fall before the Lord in worship, and offer Him our lives without hesitation. Then, as the prophet promises, our hearts will overflow with joy at what we see.

epiphany house blessing

On the Feast of the Epiphany in the Domestic Church you are invited to do the following:

• Take home blessed chalk which will be available in the narthex from 3-6 January and mark the door of your house with 20 + C + M + B + 26. The year of the Incarnation of Our Lord is accompanied by the initials CMB. In Latin, they stand for two things: Christus mansionem benedicat – May Christ bless this home, as well as the traditional names of the Three Kings, whose relics are in Cologne Cathedral in Germany: Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar.

A possible prayer to say:

May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is your incarnate Word, now and forever. Amen.

Ideas for celebrating in your home:

- It is traditional to celebrate Epiphany with a Kings Cake: a sweet cake that contains an object like a plastic figure, bean or nut. If you get the bean, you are King or Queen for the day!
- Nativity scene: the infant Jesus could be given a small gold crown or regal robe. The figures of the wise men should have reached the manger by now!
- Put on a play: celebrate the three kings by asking children to act out the story of the Magi coming to visit the newborn king. Bedsheets and tablecloths make great robes and crowns can be homemade (tip: Burger King is happy to give out crowns to customers!). Children can carry the three gifts to the Christ-child in the manger: click here for how to make edible "gifts" that are symbolic of the gold, frankincense and myrrh. Be sure to sing "We Three Kings"!
- Eat something "golden": Honey, gold-wrapped chocolate coins, banana bread, or tea with honey — no special baking required.
- Read Matthew 2:1–12 aloud together, then ask one simple question: What gift would I bring Jesus?

how long should your decorations remain?

Christmas is a season! The festive home décor and celebration should continue until the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord or even until the Feast of the Presentation (Candlemas) on 2 February.

january is dedicated to the holy name of Jesus

- do not take the Lord's name in vain and do not allow anyone or anything to do so around you (including turning off what you're watching or listening to, if it does)
- adopt the pious practice of bowing your head whenever you say or hear the name of Jesus
- decorate your domestic church (home) in colors
 of white (first half of January is the liturgical season
 of Christmas, represented by liturgical color of
 white for purity) and green (second half of January
 begins ordinary time with the liturgical color green
 representing hope as a sprouting seed) and the
 letters IHS, perhaps decorated and framed.
- write His name on your home using the Epiphany home blessing & blessed chalk available in the Narthex
- every day, pray to Joseph and Mary to increase your love for their Son, along with your reverence for His Holy Name.
- pray the Golden Arrow Prayer in reparation for blasphemies against His Most Holy Name

Golden Arrow Prayer: May the most holy, most sacred, most adorable, most incomprehensible and unutterable Name of God be always praised, blessed, loved, adored and glorified in Heaven, on earth, and under the earth, by all the creatures of God, and by the Sacred Heart of Our Lord Jesus Christ, in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar. Amen.



epiphany

On the Solemnity of the Epiphany of the Lord, the Church celebrates the manifestation of Christ to the nations, revealed as King, God, and Savior. The Blessing of Epiphany Water will take place on Monday, 5 January at 7p. This rite consists solely of the traditional blessing of water according to the Roman Ritual; there will be no Mass that evening. The blessed water may be taken home and used throughout the year as a sacramental for the blessing of homes and families, recalling both the Baptism of the Lord and the sanctification of all creation by Christ. Please place the water you want blessed inside the altar rail (Main Altar) prior to Mass beginning and pick it up after.
