From Our Pastor

An Extraordinary Parish for Ordinary People

Dear Friends in Christ,

There are a few sins out there that seem to be awfully prevalent in our culture, and even many Catholics engage in them mindlessly without realizing how serious they are. And they are extraordinarily destructive of human relationships as well as our relationship with God.

Gossip

Detraction is when we talk about another person's faults or imperfections that may be true, but in a way which is totally unnecessary, motivated by unhelpful curiosity or a lack of charity, and with people who have no right to know. Calumny is when that speech is also untrue, whether the person sharing about it knows it is untrue or not. Public figures are often the target of gossip. Whether gossip takes the form of detraction or calumny, it carries the potential to break people apart. It also comes from a place of pride, as if the person sharing it is the judge and jury of people and situations, which often cannot be known in their totality. In our community, schools and churches are often the worst places for gossip!

Rash judgment

Rash judgment is when we jump to conclusions about another person's motives, intentions, or think we know the whole story behind even actions that we are eyewitnesses of. Social media now gives a platform for rash judgment in the most appalling way, and can destroy people's reputations and lives.

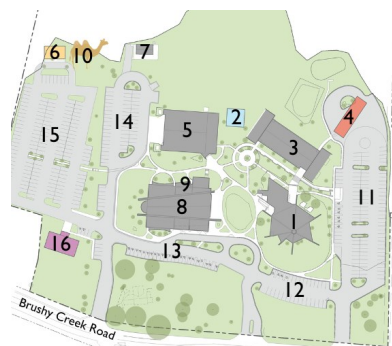
Being an accessory to another's sin.

When you actively help another person to sin, when you cowardly remain silent when your silence is knowingly interpreted as consent to avoid conflict, or when you congratulate or celebrate people when they commit a sin or place themselves in a state of impaired communion with the Church, these are all varying degrees of being an accessory to another's sin. I routinely see Catholics who act as if the teaching of Christ and His Church on marriage and family life is irrelevant, and act as if a Catholic who marries outside of the Church is not a grave sin. I routinely see Catholics who flirt with various forms of heresy, apostasy and schism, and think that if a Catholic starts frequenting a non-Catholic church or a church not in full communion with the Apostolic See, it's not really all that bad. The Church actually automatically excommunicates a person who assists another in procuring an abortion, she takes it so seriously. The reality is, you are your brother's keeper. Mortal sin is mortal sin and kills the soul, and unrepented sin leads to hell. Even if you have not committed the sin yourself, being an accessory is scandalous to the Cross of Christ and imperils your own soul.

In Galatians 6.1, St Paul writes: *Brothers, if anyone is caught in any transgression, you who are spiritual should restore him in a spirit of gentleness. Keep watch on yourself, lest you too be tempted. As soon as the name of another person crosses your lips, you could pour your heart out in prayer and intercession for that person, and if you are able, gently challenge them. Anything else is to risk your own soul.*

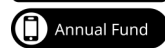

Silence

A Simple Guide to Making a Holy Hour

What is a Holy Hour?

A Holy Hour is not about "doing" something perfectly; it is about "being" with Someone who loves you. It is an hour consecrated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, truly present in the Holy Eucharist. Whether you spend it reading, praying, or simply sitting in silence, the goal is the same: to be with Him.

If you are unsure how to fill the time, try dividing the hour into four 15-minute segments.

00-15 Minutes: Preparation & Adoration

Goal: Quiet your mind and recognize Who is before you.

- **Enter:** Genuflect slowly on both knees. You are entering the throne room of the King.
- **Breathe:** Kneel or sit comfortably. Take a few deep breaths to release the tension of the drive, the workday, and your to-do list.
- **Adore:** Read a Psalm or praise (like Psalm 8 or Psalm 145) or simply repeat a short prayer:
"Jesus, I believe You are truly present here. I adore You. I love You."
- **Silence:** Allow the dust of your day to settle.

15-30 Minutes: Contrition & Thanksgiving

Goal: Open your heart to receive mercy and express gratitude.

- **Contrition:** Briefly examine your conscience. Where have you fallen short this week? Offer these failures to Jesus and ask for His strength to begin again.
- **Thanksgiving:** Shift your focus to gratitude. Name 3-5 specific blessings from the past week (a conversation, a sunset, a moment of relief). Thank Him for the gift of the Eucharist.

30-45 Minutes: Intercession & Supplication

Goal: Bring the needs of the world to the foot of the altar.

- **For Others:** Pray for your family, your friends, your enemies. Pray for the Church, the Pope, and your parish priest.
- **For the World:** Pray for peace and for those who do not know Christ.
- **For Yourself:** Pour out your own heart. Share your worries, your fears, and your desires with him as you would with a trusted friend. He wants to hear it all.

45-60 Minutes: Contemplation & Resolution

Goal: Simply look at Him, and let Him look at you.

- **The Gaze:** Put away the books and the prayer lists. Spend this final quarter in simple silence. Rest in the knowledge that you are loved.
- **Resolution:** Ask Jesus, "What is one thing You want me to do this week?" Make a small, concrete resolution to carry the grace of this hour into your daily life.
- **Depart:** Thank Him for this time. Leave slowly, carrying the peace of the sanctuary out into the world.

How to Pray a Holy Hour

To pray a holy hour, all you need is a tabernacle with a lit sanctuary lamp, a Bible, and perhaps a Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church (available online).

Three Rules

1. **Be Silent.** Don't rattle prayers or silently review stresses. Be still exteriorly and interiorly.
2. **Be Attentive.** It's not simply a reading hour — reading should be an entry-point to prayer.
3. **Be Alert.** Sit, stand, or kneel respectfully. Quick tip: If you get sleepy, stand up!

Minute-by-Minute

There is no one way to pray a holy hour. The following might help if you get lost in the hour, but feel free to reconfigure it to suit your needs.

:00-:05 – Begin

First 5 Minutes: Ask the Holy Spirit to help you, then make acts of faith, hope and charity. Tell God how you believe, trust and love him. Ask for more faith, hope and love.

Quick tip: There are great prayers to the Holy Spirit and Acts of Faith, Hope and Love in the Compendium.

:05-:15 – Adoration

Next 10 Minutes: Adore God. He holds the universe like a seed in the palm of his hand. He is all powerful, all good, more beautiful than we can imagine, and more real than the small things that we grasp so easily. Imagine Christ sitting with you.

Tell him: "Oh my God, I adore your divine greatness from the depths of my littleness; you are so great, and I am so small." or "Glory be ..."

Repeat as long as necessary.

Quick Tip: Try the Te Deum in the Compendium. Scriptural helps for adoration—Exodus 33:18-23; Song

of Songs 2:8-17; Matthew 2:1-11; John 1:1-18; Colossians 1:15-20; Philippians, 2:6-11.

:15-:25 – Contrition

Next 10 Minutes: Offer reparation. It's not your love for God, but his for you that saves. Examine your conscience. Offer reparation for the sins of the world. Pray: "Oh my Jesus, I am so sorry. Forgive me." (Imagine Jesus on the cross; kiss each wound.)

Quick tip: Scriptures for contrition—1 Corinthians 13:4-7; Colossians 3:5-10; 1 Timothy 1:12-17; James 3:2-12; 1 John 1:5-2:6; Penitential Psalms: 6, 32, 38, 51, 102, 130, 142.

:25-:40 – Meditation

Next 15 Minutes: Contemplate God's action. You may wish to meditatively pray the Stations of the Cross or a Rosary. Or:

Scriptural meditation. Read a brief Gospel passage. Imagine the scene. Notice Christ's reactions. Think of three ways the passage applies to your own life. Meditate on each line.

Doctrinal meditation. Read Scripture or Catechism passages that apply to a doctrine of the Church. Appreciate God's plan and find ways it applies to you. (Perhaps: Sun, Resurrection; Mon, Incarnation; Tues, Mercy/confession; Wed, Holy Spirit; Thurs, Eucharist; Fri, Passion; Sat., Mary).

Life meditation. Or, deepening your examination of conscience, look at your own life. Which kind of pride do you most fall into? Selfishness (valuing yourself most), Vanity (valuing others opinions most), Sensuality (valuing comforts most). Pray for the opposite virtues: Charity (serving others first), Fidelity (putting Christ's opinion first), Discipline (accepting your crosses).

:40-:50 – Thanksgiving

Next 10 Minutes: Express gratitude for all God's gifts. He didn't just create you, he sustains your existence out of love in every moment.

Thank him for literally everything, and be specific: food, shelter, clothing, health, family, friends, teachers, coworkers, home, and most of all spiritual gifts — faith, hope, love, this time of prayer, the Catholic faith, the disciples who reached you.

Thank God for answers to prayer. Thank him for crosses. Thank him for creating you and caring so much for you that he died for you.

Quick tip: Scriptures for thanksgiving - Genesis 1; Genesis 8:15-22; Job 1:13-22; Daniel 3:46 ff.; Matthew 6:25-34; Luke 17:11-19; Psalms: 8, 65, 66, 100, 111.

:50-:55 – Petition God

Next 5 Minutes: Ask God for what you and others need. He is the king of the universe. He's in control, even when it isn't obvious.

Pray for: The Church, the pope's intentions, for those who are suffering, for priests and bishops, for religious, for vocations, for your country, your family, for what you need most in the spiritual life. Pray for peace and the protection of the institution of the family. Pray for those who have asked for prayers.

:55-1:00

Final 5 Minutes: Make a resolution to act on a light of the Holy Spirit you received: something doable and checkable.

Ask the Blessed Mother to help you, perhaps with Marian prayers from the Compendium.


theology of the body talk


